I am a scholar, an educationalist and a reformist.


I am a visionary, a pioneer and a stalwart of industry.

Helen Adams Keller, distinguished American author, political activist and lecturer who was the first deaf blind person to earn a bachelor of arts degree in the early nineteenth century famously quoted.

In the sublime corridors of immortality, the upper echelons "Character cannot be developed in ease and guiet. Only strengthened, ambition inspired, and success achieved."

> In the 1960s, Racial segregation was the most devastating aspect of the South African policy of apartheid. The government forcibly relocated Indians and Yunus bha's father's general dealership store shut down. During those agonising times of hopelessness and despair, the Suleman family stuck together with solidarity.

Yunus Suleman once again faced discrimination when he received his degree in accountancy but struggled to find a job in Durban. He was forced to relocate to Johannesburg in the 1970s. During those antagonising days of White Supremacy in South Africa, the colour of a man's skin took precedent in job allocation over his qualifications and capabilities.

After his initial struggles, Yunus Suleman got a job and worked at the Accounting and Audit firm of Arthur Andersen for 20 years. Later on he became a Senior Partner before the integration of Andersen and KPMG in 2002 but not before another trial by fire. In 1998 to prove his leadership credentials, Yunus Suleman took up the challenge to head the Nigerian Audit and Consulting division of the Andersen conglomerate and shifted with his family from Capetown to Nigeria .

" I distinctly recollect those years

when intrastructure was poor in Nigeria and basic amenities like uninterrupted electricity, water and telephone communications were unavailable to most. There were many days when we sat in darkness for long hours without electricity as there was no diesel available for the generators as well. Those were very tough times for my wife too as she had to teach our six year old to read under candle light. The telephones never worked and she felt isolated in a new country away from her family and friends in South Africa."

Undeterred, Yunus Suleman went about his job and in just two years he was recalled to South Africa to head the Audit Function of Andersen in his home country. A clear endorsement of his leadership abilities.

True to the words of Hellen Keller, Yunus Suleman's unending trials and tribulations only strengthened his resolve and he rose like the phoenix to stake his claim for the top executive's post at KPMG.

As Chairman of one of the finest audit and accountancy firms in the world. Yunus bha has been the "Trusted Business Advisor" to many stalwarts of the Telecommunications, Oil and Gas, retail and media industry. He has spoken at various prestigious platforms including participation at the World Economic Forum for Africa and has been extensively interviewed for his perceptive thoughts and views on global finance. Yunus Suleman has collaborated on projects relating to the National Development Plan (NDP) for South Africa as an important member of Business Leadership South Africa and served on the "Beyond Advocacy" BLSA working group driving the role of business in implementing the NDP.
