I have been an avid cricketer from a very young age. When I was 9 or 10 years old, I used to play cricket alone in my room, bouncing the ball off the walls. When I threw the ball towards the wall, I started making a peculiar roaring sound

Unfortunately my father noticed my odd behavior and got disturbed. He was perturbed that something had happened to his son since he constantly plays alone in the room and makes that godforsaken noise, so one day my elder sister sat me down and asked me point blank as to why do I do this and that Abu is getting very worried.

I stubbornly refused to answer.

Upon her persistence I told her that I make that sound because I imagine myself in a packed stadium, I have taken a prized wicket and the entire stadium has come alive. My wicket taking delivery has been greeted with thunderous applause and the passionate fans are chanting my name.

My sister looked at me with disbelief, thought I had gone soft in the head but was grateful that it wasn't anything of immediate concern.

Then came the day when I bought the Karachi Kings

cricket team in the **Pakistan Super League (PSL)**. I distinctly recall the time, Karachi was reeling under severe political turmoil, the city was thrust in a horrific vortex of violence and there was blood bath.

for over 10 years, I had to pull many strings and we requested for it to be kept open for the **Karachi Kings inauguration** – it was the consummate launch ceremony.

The day arrived, the inaugural ceremony of Karachi Kings was about to commence, my father and I received a flurry of calls to rush to the stadium as a sizeable crowd had gathered. We reached the National Stadium and I got out of my car, took my father's hand and walked into the tunnel, leading into the ground. While walking hand in hand, both of us were having a casual chit chat.

I like to hold my father's hand and its a constant habit. Its the Prophet's sunnah which I follow very ardently, one is not to walk in front of your father and the other is not to be seated before your father, both amount to pride so I practice these invaluable sunnahs and always hold my father's hand while I follow him humbly, at his side, just a step behind.

So while talking to each other we stepped out of the tunnel, into the colossal National Stadium which was filled to the brim. A capacity crowd of thousands of rambunctious fans had laid siege of the stadium. Mind you, it wasn't even a match.

The crowd was chanting "Salman, Salman!!"

I asked my father in disbelief, "What are they saying?" and he replied that they are shouting your name.

This was 6 years ago when I was 40 and I was conjuring up this dream since I was 10. So three decades later, I wasn't playing a match, bowling a single ball but the dream that I envisioned as a child had finally come true in that moment.

I took a lap of the stadium with my father by my side, soaked in the adulation, absorbed the electric atmosphere and expressed our love and gratitude to Karachiites for coming out in full force to support their team under difficult circumstances.

They were thanking me for bringing cricket back into their lives. This was a city in celebration, this was the city of lights, this was a city now abuzz, this was the Karachi that had come alive, this was my Karachi, yeh hai Karachi!!

At that moment, I revisited my childhood, became that 10 year old boy who used to bowl balls against the wall...

The **Salman Iqbal** Story

Early Life



Tell us a bit about your childhood, and what kind of a child were you?

My childhood was completely different from the childhood which kids have today. No gadgets, no phones and although my childhood and school years were mostly spent in the hot Dubai weather, we always remained outdoors. I was an extremely shy kid because I had a stammering problem. Hence to avoid people from finding out about my speech impairment, I usually kept quiet and to myself and started devoting more time in sports where my playing did all the talking.

During Middle School I started playing cricket. I soon started developing my skills and excelled at it. I was one of the star players in my school's cricket team, I played for Lahore Gymkhana, for UAE and even toured England and South Africa, all at the tender age of 12 and 13.

Thanks to the exposure and popularity cricket gave me, when I was 18 or 19, slowly and gradually my stammer disappeared and I developed confidence to interact and engage with others. From being this shy, introvert kid I turned into an outgoing extrovert young adult.

How was it growing up the legendary ARY family?

We grew up in a joint family, with my uncles, aunts and cousins, all extremely close knit. Though we were quite well-off, there were strict rules in our family that all children had to adhere to. We were brought up grounded with extreme humility and not exposed to the wealth associated with the family.

We were not allowed to use chauffeurs and family cars for our leisure, we were not allowed to spend on anything extravagant and we used to get a limited amount as pocket money.

I honestly, did not have any idea about my family's affluence till the time I got back from the US and joined the family business! Upon going through the balance sheets and the business financials it dawned upon me, how wealthy Haji Saab and my father really were.

Tell us about Haji Saab ARY, your relationship with him, the life lessons you learnt and the values you imbibed.

In memoni there is a term "Gur Sutti" which means that when a baby is born, we give them honey or gur, at my birth, this ritual was performed by the Late Haji Saab.

In our family, Haji Saab had a



really strong persona, despite being the second oldest in the family.

His formidable personality came from the fact that he had command over everything. You could sit with him and have extended discussions about anything and everything under the sun.

Being the first son in the family, Haji Saab was extremely fond of me, and kept me with him at all times. He loved getting my photographs taken, and you could frequently observe that in all my childhood pictures, I am somehow mimicking Haji Saab; the way he dressed up in a suit, the way he would hold a phone or a pen.

My deep connect with Haji Saab was much more than the uncle-nephew relationship, rather it was a father - son bond! My father Haji Iqbal travelled a lot for business and his trips used to last for weeks or months, so in his absence, Haji Saab was the father figure in our house and this was for at least 16 or 17 years of my life. We were accustomed to having Haji Saab in the house as the father figure and we used to fondly call him "Baba". I called my father "Abu".

Baba had a great impact on my life, on my upbringing in the formative years and I really hope that I can emulate the values which he has instilled in me and pass them on to my future generations.

Take us through your schooling and college years.

My schooling was in Dubai and I went to the University of Houston for my undergrad where I did my Bachelors (double majors) in Finance and Economics. University life was a great learning experience! I used to live in a two-bedroom apartment which I shared with 5 friends.

The University campus was huge and the distance from one class to another was around 11 kilometres and for that we had to take the campus shuttle. Since the city of Houston was humongous and commuting was an issue, I used to pester my father to buy me a car. At that same time, our close family friend's sons were studying in Boston. Now, compared to Houston, Boston is relatively smaller, so his sons used to get around on bicycles. Hence my requests for the car was always declined by my father and he used to reprimand me by saying that why do I need a car when Hussain uncle's sons are perfectly fine getting around on bicycles. Since my father had never been to Houston, he had absolutely no idea of how big the campus or the city was compared to Boston. Eventually, when he visited me, he realised the ground realities and finally bought me a car.

The bicycle Irony:

Even today, when I sit around with my friends, reminiscing the university days and they share stories about being able to afford only a bicycle during the college days to get from point A to point B.

I wholeheartedly concur, "Meri bhi zindagi ki shuruwat cycle say he hui thi!"

The irony being that despite my family's considerable monetary resources that could have afforded me the simple luxury of owning a car, I yet had to bike it out.



So that line famously sums up my "privileged" growing up years in the ARY family!

What was your first job?

To cover my living expenses, during my college years I had to do several odd jobs and my first job was at a gas station, the next was as a pizza delivery boy at a place called Joker's Pizza, my third job was cleaning cars in Houston and my fourth job was as a bouncer. My first real job was when I set up the whole exchange division of ARY which still exists.

The Turning Point and My Lucky Charm

The birth of my first-born child Sumaiya changed my life completely and in a very positive way Alhamdullilah! She's my lucky charm and was bestowed upon me as a gift by Allah SWT and I am extremely grateful for her. She is a child with special needs and has recently turned 21. Her birth changed me as a person, I got a completely different perspective about life, my career took a different path, I started television and I have never looked back since. She is truly Allah's blessing for me.

How did the ARY brand come about?

Our business was initially known as Abdul Razzak Yaqoob Traders and all four brothers were involved in it. While the Late Haji Saab was the financial genius behind it and had scaled the business to great heights my father -Haji Iqbal was the creative mind behind it and was involved in the marketing.

It was my father who turned the trade name of "Abdul Razzak Yaqoob Traders" into ARY and built this name into a brand. He also launched the ARY Gold Bars, the ARY Gold Rainbow Hearts etc. Everything related to marketing was my father, and everything related to finance was Late Haji Saab. I saw my father sponsoring events, doing ad shoots etc. The business acumen which Late Haji Saab possessed, coupled with the marketing mind set of my father, along with the execution abilities of my other uncles have made the business what it is today.



ARY has been a game changer in the media landscape. Please tell us about it's birth and considering that you come from a conservative Memon family, how

did you end up in Media?

Post Sumaiya's birth I had moved to London in 1999 early 2000s for her check-ups and coincidentally, At that time, my father had invested some money in a small 8-hour TV station in London called The Pakistani Channel (TPC). Since I was there, my father asked me to divest our investment in TPC. Upon meeting the station owner, I found out that the channel was closing down and I immediately informed my father about the development. My father flew down to London and started negotiating with the station owner. After a couple of days, I received an ecstatic telephone call from him, informing me that he had purchased a television channel. I laughingly asked him whether it was CNN or BBC to which he calmly replied - "It is TPC".

That is how TPC became part of the ARY business portfolio and my family, taking advantage of my presence in

An uphill battle:

Since my uncles had conferred the responsibility of running this channel on to me, I abided by their decision. However, running a channel without a background in anything remotely related to media was a huge challenge. I was supposed to be the numbers guy, my education was in finance! I was happy dealing with banks and money markets! I had almost acquired a license to open a bank in London! This television mumbo-jumbo was something which I had never done or heard before.

And once I took over this responsibility, I had to leave my day job as Head of Treasury of the ARY Group. With a heavy heart, I entered the World of media and spearheaded ARY Diaital. Initially, during the first 6 years, I hated it! We were bleeding money. Television was never a part of my career plans; it was not something which I had aspired to do! I had to learn everything from scratch but being a man that doesn't quit, I put all my effort, time and money into it.

Alhamdullilah, we are now one of the largest television networks in Asia and the largest Urdu speaking network in the world.

Take us through the spectacular rise of the ARY Digital?



EARTHQUAKE RELIEF EFFORTS IN HAITI

How did you turn it all around?

When ARY started, it was one hybrid channel covering everything; from Quran recitation, to dramas to music and the news. Our vision for ARY Digital was to make it a truly global Pakistani urdu channel and no matter where in the world, if there be 2 Urdu speaking people, ARY should be broadcasting on their televisions. With this vision and a lot of hard work we grew exponentially and moved our headquarters from London to Dubai in 2003 and then to Karachi in 2007. By that time, we had grown to 126 countries, we were on 15 satellites and had 12 TV stations.

A heartening moment beyond borders

In January 2010, a devastating earthquake with a magnitude of 7.5 destroyed the capital Port-au-Prince of Haiti and other cities nearby. Though the earthquake had lasted for a mere 30 seconds, the landscape, and the lives of the two million people inhabiting the small country changed completely. Being termed as the poorest country in the Western Hemisphere, Haiti went into a state of emergency as its contact with rest of the world was cut off. Appeals for Humanitarian aid were issued by many aid organisations in the UN. Many countries responded to the appeals and launched fund raising efforts. In Pakistan, the ARY network launched a fundraising campaign for Haiti and I personally joined the team of Doctors Beyond Borders for the earthquake relief efforts in Haiti. Being on ground zero, I witnessed the catastrophic effects of the earthquake which had paralysed the entire country. Hundreds of people had died, thousands were injured,



and millions of people were rendered homeless without any access to food, water or medical supplies.

While assisting with the relief efforts there, I came across 2 Urdu speaking families, who invited me to have lunch with them. While having lunch at their house, I just glanced at the TV there and saw that it was showing ARY Digital. That was the moment when I honestly felt that all my hard work and effort had paid off. My channel had lived up to its vision and reached a country where there were very few Urdu speaking families. We had brought messages of Pakistan to Haiti through ARY. We were the ambassadors of Pakistan! This was such a heartening moment for me and from the dinner table, I called my team in Pakistan and told them we had done our job!

Transitioning to ARY Group

During Haji Saab's lifetime around 2013 and 2014, the family made me the Group CEO for ARY. Since ARY Digital had stabilised and things were now running smoothly, I took over the reins of the ARY Group with the Late Haji Saab's blessings. I believe I have imbibed a lot of Haji Saab's personality and I have learnt a lot from him. The work ethics which have been ingrained in me by him have enabled me to work quite aggressively and diligently, to look for solutions rather than sit on problems. To excel in my work rather than to accept mediocrity.

What are the important business ethics of the ARY conglomerate? What have success and failure taught you?

Our whole business is based on the foundation of honouring our commitments. If there is one value which has been drilled into me by my elders, it is to never ever go back on my word or my commitment. There have been instances where we have lost considerable sums of money just because we had made a commitment earlier and could not go back on it. Thus, any commitment by my group or by the members of my group will be honoured because we strongly believe that our word is our bond.

Another core learning is to never ever leave friends behind. Especially in their time of need. Hence honouring the bond of friendship is also very dear to me because if you are friends with someone then you need to accept that person with all their flaws and stick with them through thick and thin

Another very important lesson I have learnt is that whenever vou rise in the ranks you should never forget the people around you in every step of the way because when and if there is a reversal of fortune, you come back down with a thud and bump into them again. Life is such that when you are successful, people gravitate towards you. At that point you don't need friends because everyone is your friend. But when you have hit rock bottom and 1 know what it feels like when you are there, it is at that time when you need your friends the most! That is the time you realise who your true friends are and who really is in your corner.

The ARY workfamily has expanded to almost 5000. When you are hiring, what are the key traits that you look for? What does it take to impress Salman Iqbal?

The length of your tenure at the previous company! I like people who have stuck by their employers through thick or thin. For me loyalty is the most important factor. When I am hiring someone, I am partnering with them. I want to build lasting partnerships! Today the ARY group is almost 20 years old and the people in the top management and the middle management within the Group have been with us for at least 10 to 15 years and some even longer.

News channel owners are also known as kingmakers, how do you view this title and is it true or a misconception?

Honestly, I hate this title! The only Kingmaker in the world is Allah SWT, He is the only one who can make Kings and make Kings into Paupers. Our job in the media is just to relay the information and that perhaps puts us in an advantageous position since we get the information before the World gets it. Apart from being called Kinamaker, we have also been branded as "media walay" we are not "media walay"! This is also a business and we are businessmen through and through. When we got into media, we analysed it through the lens of a businessman at that time and saw potential. Now look at the media industry, it has become one of the pillars of the Pakistan economy, not just Pakistan, the media is one of the pillars of the economy of most countries across the alobe.

How do you run such a vast media empire and deal with the stress that comes with the job?

A wise person once said "Stress lenay ka nahi, denay ka" so I have adopted this mantra. I do have a very stressful life, but I delegate. I have a great team who manages everything for me and does a amazing job at that! Though I remain busy from morning till evening with work, I have never ever allowed myself to get stressed by anything. I believe that the ability to not take any stress is a blessing on me from Allah SWT. Though I do give stress to other people but then hey that's part of the job.

With such an explosion in media how do you keep up with the everchanging digital world and evolving

content.

I have a proficient team which is quite hands on and I am very hands on with my team. Within my Group, I have built a very strong R&D team of around 35 to 40 people and their only job is to focus on Research and Development.


The main function of the Research team is to identify new technologies / equipment out there, what new fad is picking up, what is trending on social media, and once that research is complete they give it to me and I review it and pick out interesting bits and forward that to the development team who then start thinking about what could be done and how that idea can be further developed and implemented or how the new technology can be procured. We always try to be one step ahead of everyone, we mostly know and can predict what is going to happen in our field and are ready to adapt to change.

Your greatest achievement.

I believe, despite having accumulated sizeable wealth, recognition, fame and success Alhamdullilah I feel I still haven't achieved much yet. However, I do believe that Inshallah what I achieve in my tenure as a President of WMO will be my greatest achievement. I grew up in the shadow of greatness of my uncle Late Haji Saab, and he was really driven by his passion to do good for the community and that is why he laid the foundation of WMO. Hence, living up to his legacy in WMO and realising the dream which he had envisioned for Memons around the World, would be my greatest achievement.

If not media, what would have been an alternate career option for Mr. Salman Iqbal?

Banking and Finance! Had television not happened to me I would still have had a budding career in banking and finance and might have opened my own bank in London!



"ARY Laguna" is a testament to the fact that Salman Iqbal dreams big, what motivated you to enter the real estate market in Pakistan with such a massive project? Any other extraordinary project such as the ARY Laguna being planned in another

city of the World?

It's not our first time in real estate, in fact we have been quite active in the real estate sector in Pakistan. We have been a part of many construction projects in Pakistan and the UAE as well. However, in Pakistan we never did it under the brand name of ARY, so in that regard it was the first time that ARY launched its real estate arm in Pakistan and offered something really unique for the end consumers. The uniqueness came from the fact that ARY is the only company in Pakistan which managed to procure the Crystal Lagoons Technology. This is a Chilean patented technology and is manufactured in the US. We managed to negotiate and convince them to build a project in Pakistan. This is a feather in ARY's cap that we signed them on and then launched the "ARY Laguna"

Initially, we have launched ARY Laguna in Karachi and Gujranwala and we are planning to go to Lahore, Islamabad and Peshawar. Our target market is just Pakistan for the time being as Pakistan itself is a huge market with great potential, so we want to see how this project fares here and then we will see if and how we can replicate it in other global locations. It is a mammoth project which has received encouraging feedback and an overwhelming response.

You've seen Prime Ministers, you've seen governments

at work, at the state level, at the international level. Pakistan is at an exciting time, at an exciting place. What are your views about the current state of the country?

2020 for many countries has been nothing short of an economic debacle except for Pakistan. Due to Covid-19 most of the countries were shut. The plan that the honourable Prime Minister Mr. Imran Khan had for tackling the Covid-19 crisis despite its vocal criticism has worked.

Its not that we don't have any Covid-19 cases in Pakistan but if we look at the bigger picture, the number of cases is less compared to other countries. Our markets were and are still open, our country is open, and all the business sectors in this country are right now up and running and Alhamdullilah, we as a country have managed the situation quite well and are in fact better off than many other countries.



Media



The films being produced by your production house have been highest grossers...what's the secret of your success.

The secret of our success is that we are driven by the love for our people and our country. In the olden days, the Pakistan film industry was a giant but then it saw a downturn and it eventually shutdown for around 25 years. I had a dream of restarting and reviving the Pakistani film industry. Driven by this goal, we rolled the dice and invested into the Pakistani film industry and by the grace of Allah with our decisions and strategy we are now an integral part of the film industry. The All-time highest grossing films of Pakistan are all from the ARY stable. We are now beating our own records at the box office. Our first movie did a business of PKR. 250 million, then we did 500 million and now we are up to a Billion!!

What's your favourite movie and TV series from the ones you have

produced?


Mere pass tum ho for sure and Jawani Phir Nahin Aani part 1.

How involved do you get in the process of movie making? Are you a part of the creative process?

I am involved initially when reviewing the script and this process is known as a one liner. Once that is done the movie is then taken forward to the production houses. For the one liner we have a panel which votes for a script. Like for example there was this movie "Punjab Nahi Jaaongi" it was our second biggest blockbuster but me to give it a shot. After a serious debate, I gave my go ahead and it turned out to be the biggest block buster of that time. Hence, in the process of filmmaking you must sometimes go with your gut feeling, take brave decisions and go against the tide.

Dobara Phir Say – perfect balance between creativity and producer's acumen

The movie under the banner of ARY films "Dobara Phir Say", was shot in New York by Mehreen Jabbar. She's an amazing director with lots of hits under her belt! While discussing the script with her, there was one scene in the movie, the focal point

when the script came to us the complete panel had given it a thumbs down and we shelved the project. But Humayun Saeed, the main lead in the film came to my house at night and convinced

where the couple meets for the first time. Mehreen wanted to shoot that scene underground in the NY Subway. However, I told her that in this scene, the audience will only be able to



see the dreary NY subway, so why not shoot this scene on the New York – New Jersey Ferry which would also give us a fantastic view of the New York skyline! She aareed to it and that scene stood out in the film. These are the times when I have to intervene in the creative process and think from the audience's perspective. Of course being an astute producer, I cut the cost to a tenth of what was needed to shoot on the subway and we also captured New York in all its glory.

How do you maintain the thin line between encroaching on the creative freedom of the director and imposing your ideas as a producer? Does this limit you to work only with people on the same wavelength?

Basically, I give a lot of creative freedom, but sometimes I do have to impose and draw some lines because I am not only the producer, but I am also

the financier. However, this definitely does not limit me to work with certain people only, I am always open to new and fresh ideas. I have produced movies with almost every producer and every director in this country.

Your Advice to new producers or production house owners, aspirants.

Know your market first before you produce a movie and it's imperative that you do! You cannot impose a Bollywood or a Hollywood idea on the Pakistani market! You need to research your market first and understand their needs and wants!

What's the way forward for Pakistani movies... will they ever become global or even come close to **Bollywood?**

We are global! Pakistani movies have sometimes arossed even more than Bollywood movies in the UK and US. In UK, if a Bollywood Amir Khan starrer is opening on 112 screens than Pakistani movies are opening on 60-70 screens, which is an achievement in itself!

Web-series are now replacing traditional television channels - being in the media industry do how are you adapting to this new digital revolution? Does **ARY have any** plans of entering the digital media industry? Can we expect an ARY platform rivalling **Netflix in Pakistan?**

Television is still very strong in Pakistan as well as globally. Web series are of course taking over, but I would not say that they have completely taken over and replaced television as a medium. I believe we haven't missed the boat. There is work going on for a digital platform, but it's too soon for me to disclose anything yet there are somethings known as business secrets!

Cricket



Cricket, myself and Late Haji Saab:

My love for cricket comes from my family. I have seen my uncle Late Haji Saab passionately following cricket. I remember at that time, international cricket was only available on Doordarshan channel. So, to get that channel, we had installed a huge dish antenna at our place in Dubai. Late Haji Saab used to watch every single match which came on television and I used to sit next to him, glue eyed through every broadcast. There were times when the Dish Antenna would move. and we would lose picture. Only the commentary could be heard, but Haji Saab's passion for the sport was such that he would continue to sit in front of the TV and listen intently for the entire duration of the match. When there were no matches coming on the television he would switch on the radio and listen to the cricket commentary for hours. His passion for the game remains unmatched.

When I bought my cricket team, Karachi Kings, the first thought that flashed across my mind was had Haji Saab been alive, he would have been ecstatic, and he would have been my tallest pillar of support in this whole venture.

Haji Saab was extremely cricket savvy and knew of all the cricket players, so whenever I go for my team selection in the drafting, I just think that had Haji Saab been here by my side today he would have been so incisive and helpful in the team selection. His keen I was on a family vacation in London and the Pakistan Super League (PSL) bidding process was due to start in Pakistan so I had asked Tariq Wasi (Current CEO Karachi Kings), to place a bid for Karachi. He requested me to be available in person as my good friend Mr. Arif Habib was another contender for Karachi and was personally attending the bidding process. But I wasn't convinced.

As I was having this conversation, my father walked in and at the spur of the moment just said "Don't let Karachi go". Despite my reluctance, he asked me to



insight, knowledge of the game and critical analysis of each player, would have been an invaluable asset. His advice would be key in picking the right players and would have really taken me a long way in getting the winning combination for the Karachi Kings.

I think my love for cricket is one of the prized sentiments which I have inherited from him and I will always treasure it.

How did Karachi Kings come about?

catch a flight to Lahore where the bidding was about to take place in 48 hrs and I had to concede to his demands. I couldn't get a direct flight to Lahore since seats were sold out so I had to fly via London to Paris to Doha to Karachi and then from Karachi to Lahore just to bid for the Karachi team.

Alhamdullilah, I placed my bid and was announced the highest bidder. Karachi Kings became the most expensive PSL team at that time (worth USD 26 million). "Sport has the power to change the world. It has the power to inspire. It has the power to unite people in a way that little else does. It speaks to youth in a language they understand. Sport can create hope where once there was only despair."

The great Nelson Mandela had famously quoted the above lines and Rugby was his preferred sport to bring about a change in South Africa. Do you believe cricket has done the same for Pakistan? Are you planning to venture into other sports?

Not cricket, but PSL has done this for Pakistan. Prior to PSL,

the past 10 years or so there was a cricket embargo on Pakistan as no one wanted to come and play here due to security concerns. Our own home grounds had shifted to Sharjah and Dubai. Through the initiation of PSL, our focus was to bring cricket back to Pakistan. As cricket has been missing since a decade, our youngsters had started to drift away from the sport, they had moved onto other sports like football which was frequently broadcasted across Pakistan TV channels. Hence through PSL, our youngsters are passionate once again for the gentlemen's game. PSL has revived their love for cricket.

Pakistan Sports Revolution:

Pakistan is a country where 60% of the population is below the age of 25. These youngsters need avenues to burn their energy in a constructive way so why not sports. With this thought in mind, I started focusing on other sporting avenues as well. I am building gyms across Pakistan; my first gym Brave is in Lahore and another one is in Karachi where we host UFC fights. I am working with the Boxing Federation of Pakistan and partnering with international boxing sensation Aamir Khan to develop something in the field of boxing. I am meeting with the Hockey Federation of Pakistan and have plans to boost hockey. I have plans to venture into golf as well and now we are sending the 16-year-old kid who won the golf open in Karachi to participate in the Qatar Open. We have plans for tennis and we are working hard to bring more and more youngsters into sports.

My grand plan and the ultimate goal is to have a complete sports revolution in Pakistan.



THE BATTLE AGAINST FORCED CREMATION IN SRI LANKA

omen say there is no greater pain than to bear a child. We say there is no greater pain than to bury one. And then there is the mother of the 20 day old Shaykh who went through the tumultuous cycle of child birth and child loss in a blink of an eye. And she couldn't even bury her child!

Shaykh was the latest and youngest victim of Covid-19, cremated against his family's wishes, courtesy the Sri Lankan government's inhumane policy of forced cremation of all people who succumb to the virus, irrespective of their religious beliefs.

Sir Iqbal Sacranie, former Senior Vice President of the World Memon Organisation has launched a tireless crusade against the forced cremation of Muslims, who have succumbed to the Corona outbreak in Sri Lanka.

It is a blatant violation of the religious freedom, beliefs and human rights of the minority Muslim community in Sri Lanka, as Islam stipulates that the dead must be buried. In an articulate interview to the **ARY channel**, Sir Iqbal expressed his views and demanded an immediate reversal of this horrific cremation policy that is causing abject distress to the minority Muslim community in Sri Lanka.

Sir lqbal was also the founding Secretary General of the **Muslim Council of Britain (MCB)**, an organization that has pursued this pertinent matter with unabated dedication and passion.

A taskforce set up by the MCB had written to the **Sri Lankan high commissioner** in the UK demanding an immediate reversal of the unjust cremation policy. This was followed by mounting a legal challenge against the policy and bringing this pertinent matter to the urgent attention of the **United Nations Human Rights Committee (UNHRC)** for a swift resolution.

The Muslim Council of Britain also called upon the UN to halt forced cremations in Sri Lanka and submitted

a formal complaint to the UNHRC, urgently requesting the suspension of the policy. Sir ląbal is spearheading the initiative and garnering support from several heads of states and Governments across the globe who are standing steadfast with the crusader.

As the Muslim World comes together and stands in solidarity with our brethren in Sri Lanka, the World Memon Organisation applauds our stalwarts - Sir Iqbal Sacranie and **President Salman Iqbal** for their tireless endeavours against the unprecedented injustices being inflicted on our brothers and sisters in Sri Lanka.

At length, on the 10th of February, **Prime Minister Mahinda Rajapaksa** announced in parliament that permission will be granted for the burial of COVID-19 victims. Once it is gazetted it will officially reverse the dreaded policy which has been implemented in Sri Lanka since March last year.

After months of relentless pressure by human right organizations, United Nations experts, medical professionals in Sri Lanka, Muslim leaders and community organisations from across the globe, the Sri Lankan government has finally conceded.

It also brought our crusader at the doorstep of a resolute victory. When asked for his comments on the heartening news, Sir Iqbal stated "Praise be to Allah - wonderful news. Let's continue to pray that the Sri Lankan government formalises the change of policy which will bring huge relief to Muslims and other faith communities in Sri Lanka. Finally, they can bury their loved ones when they die according to the practice of their Deen."

He continued," I am immensely appreciative of the kind messages and duas received from so many but it must be made clear that it was the collective efforts of many individuals and organisations across the globe who supported the campaign wholeheartedly that has yielded positive results.

"I am particularly very pleased that every Memon I approached in different countries gave unequivocal support and undertaking to carry out the lobbying in their countries. I must record my deep appreciation for a number of individuals including our WMO President Salman Iqbal for his fullest, unconditional support. Chairman of the WMO Board of Trustees - Mr. Ashraf Sattar, the Sri Lankan contingent of Ilyas Admani, Shiraz Yunus, Rafik Kassim and Hanif Yusuf for their remarkable persistence.

Mr. Satar Dada and Gulaam Abdoola from Botswana. Mr. Solly Noor, Haroon Kalla, Adil Assamo and Feizul Ayub from South Africa for effective lobbying with their governments. We appreciate the statement from the Premier of Sri Lanka and await its implementation. Until then WMO continues to stand firm, shoulder to shoulder with Sir Iqbal Sacranie and our Muslim brethren in Sri Lanka.

On the 23rd of February, the honourable **Prime Minister of the Islamic Republic of Pakistan** visited Sri Lanka amidst protests by Muslims who vehemently demanded burial rights. **Prime Minister Imran Khan** raised the pertinent matter with his counterpart in Sri Lanka and within **48** hours the policy was gazetted.

On the 25th of February the Minister of Health Extraordinary issued 🧹 the Gazette Notification amending the regulations of the Quarantine Prevention Diseases and of Ordinance to allow burial of those that succumbed to the virus.

Mr. Salman Iqbal - President of the World Memon Organisation played a pivotal role and emphasised to Mr. Imran Khan that this important matter be raised on his official visit to Sri Lanka. A gesture testament to the good will and camaraderie shared between the two leaders.

It is a moment of great pride for the World Memon Organisation as our leaders have been on the frontline in this battle against forced cremations in Sri Lanka.

EMPOWERING THROUGH INCLUSION PROJECT

WMO strongly believes that if enough love, care, therapy, training and tenderness is extended to children with special needs, it will enable them to grow up as normal adults with the dignity and respect they deserve in a World that once thought they were different.

As a distinguished humanitarian once lovingly quipped, "They are different because they are special!"

We at WMO couldn't agree more.

The Empowering Through Inclusion project supports children with special needs and is a joint collaboration between WMO Pakistan Chapter and WMO North America Chapter.

"Special needs" is an umbrella underneath which a staggering array of diagnoses can be placed. These differently abled children may have mild learning disabilities or profound cognitive impairments; food allergies or terminal illnesses; developmental delays that catch up quickly or remain entrenched; occasional panic attacks or serious psychiatric problems.

The project was initiated on the earnest conviction that most of the children can become an active part of society and reach their full potential when given a chance hence it was aptly named "Empowering Through Inclusion". Each year WMO strives hard to achieve that objective.

The greatest hurdle that the project faced was the crippling attitude of the families, including the parents towards the children. They were already reeling under the burden of financial constraints and had to additionally support and care for a handicapped child. The innocent children bore the brunt and were often subjected to violent physical abuse - some were even tied up and locked away.

After lengthy discussions and parent counselling - the

first challenge had been overcome. Parents finally understood that their children needed their constant love, support and encouragement if they were to survive in society.

The next step was to create a team of **specially trained teachers and professionals** that were well equipped to impart lessons and cultivate skills that help the children to overcome their challenges. Special training sessions were organized at various centres in Karachi to assist the teachers in creating an environment more conducive to the child's mental, emotional, psychological and physical needs.

WMO is supporting 60 students by enrolling them in special schools and is providing specific therapies in accordance to their needs at Liyaqat National Hospital. Keeping in line with inclusivity, 3 children were also admitted into normal schools. Their activities and growth are being monitored on a regular basis. Diagnostic tests are methodically conducted to get to the root of the problem. Assessments and evaluations are carried out systematically.

In many instances, wheelchairs, walkers, hearing aids, special shoes and customized beds are tailored as per the needs of the children. Food supplements, physiotherapy and free medications too are provided in rare cases.

Vocational training is given to the children when they grow older so that they are gainfully employed and can match steps with the World.

The World Memon Organisation stands firm in our support to children with special needs. If we can bring a smile on the faces of these little angels, if we can play a small role in making their lives a bit better, if we can provide them with a brighter future, if we can care for them, enough to help them learn, grow and live their lives to the fullest; then we can proudly say that we have made a DIFFERENCE.

The "Empowering Through Inclusion" project has given us hope and hope springs eternal!







A Tribute

I had the privilege of meeting Mr. Solly Noor in the year 2013. It was the 11th WMO AGM hosted by the Middle East Chapter in the vibrant city of Dubai. As Chairman of Board of Trustees, he was kind enough to allow me to sit through the Trustee meeting, although I wasn't one. This was the beginning of a great many kindnesses, he has graciously extended to me over the years. **Our first interaction was brief but he left a lasting impression on me.**

The first thing that strikes you about Solly Noor is his exceptional command over the language. The power of the spoken word is undeniable and I had the good fortune to witness an articulate speech by the then WMO President, Mr. Satar Dada in Sri Lanka earlier that year, followed by an eloquent one by Sir Iqbal Sacranie but it was quite apparent that the **orator-in-chief** of the organisation was undoubtedly Solly Noor. It wasn't just his command over English, he held sway over all proceedings, the discussions, the meetings, even his colleagues and most of the members were under his spell. He had all the answers, as well as the last word! The second time I met Mr. Solly Noor, it was in my neck of the woods - Mumbai in early 2014. I also had the good fortune to host his wonderful wife, Zohra Noor. A decision had to be made in regards to the leadership of the India Chapter and as usual the responsibility was placed squarely upon his shoulders to make the final call. There were many strong contenders for the top post and I remember one such Indian gentleman who arrived with a large, vocal group of supporters to stake his claim.

I vividly recall the scene. The lone Solly Noor in a tiny conference room, filled with a boisterous, agitated mob clamouring for their man. As usual Mr. Solly Noor was a picture of calm, very relaxed and in supreme command, facing one onslaught after another, he listened patiently to each member of the contingent and all their arguments. I slipped out of the room for a few minutes to get some air as the atmosphere inside was getting heated and claustrophobic. When I returned, the silence was deafening.

The Indian gentleman had dropped his claim for the top post and his bunch of overzealous supporters had gone silent. They were profusely apologising to Solly Noor for raising the decibels and for taking up his precious time.

I never asked him how he did it but only he could have done it!

We met for the third time in South Africa during the latter half of 2014. Solly Noor had been unanimously elected President of the World Memon Organisation and he hosted us in Cape Town. We were spoilt rotten. Walking across the majestic Table Mountain, strolling through the scenic vineyards, whale-watching in the placid waters of Hermanus and savouring gourmet meals at the Waterfront, overlooking the pristine Cape Town harbour. We took in all the glorious sights and sounds that the Mother city had to offer. Solly & Zohra Noor, their daughters Farzana & Tasneem and son-in-law Zuneid were the most gracious hosts.

Capetown also marked the beginning of my friendship with his daughter Farzana - clearly a chip of the old block.

Solly Noor's leadership has transformed WMO. I expected nothing less but it is not his formidable personality, his astute decision making abilities or his visionary ideas that have impacted me most. It is his enduring legacy, the values that Solly and Zohra Noor have inculcated in their children and grandchildren, that have left an indelible mark on me. When I met Farzana and her children, it was quite evident that they were worthy heirs of the sublime Noor legacy. They have inherited

his generous heart and kind soul. They exude the same warmth and the rare ability that their patriarch possesses of making others feel special and cared for in his towering presence.

I was touched when he remembered and invited us to join him in celebrating my better half's birthday. I was humbled when he coaxed the gathering to deliver a standing ovation for my endeavours towards WMO and I was very moved when he called me every single day of the week when my father underwent a heart surgery. Our friendship has evolved over time and we now share a special bond. I have always been in awe of the mighty Solly Noor who displays exceptional strength in the face of adversity but it is his kindness that wins you over. The small gestures like a thoughtful message on your birthday, his affectionate words that comfort you during difficult times and his reassuring embrace that I will always be there for you, son. Just his presence in my life, makes me feel blessed.

He is a very special man and as Farzana and her children continue his precious legacy, the name Solly Noor will prevail, long after he is gone. The key to immortality is living a life worth remembering. I will always remember him. *I will always remember his kindness.*
