


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




A Tribute to the Founder


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
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ABOUT THIS REPORT BY THE **Regional Vice President**

once again. I have given a valiant effort to accomplish our objectives by giving my best being the Secretary General and Regional VP in the previous years.


WMO Pakistan Chapter has actively been involved in increasing Literacy and spurring growth in the community in the areas of Health, Rehabilitation and House Building Facilities which requires strategic, high-value investment of scarce resources, whether they come from donors, governments, or communities and we are blessed and Thankful to our Donors for their rigorous Funds coming our way and I plead for the funds to keep coming so that our recquisition is always fulfilled.

- Calling 2020 the year of pandemic won't be any less since the whole world was under the influence of COVID-19. The pandemic hit Pakistan as well and Pakistan was under an extensive lockdown. To cope up with this disaster, A Covid 19 relief committee was established under which a worldwide appeal for funds was made. The ARY Digital Network telecast a special program in support of WMO's Relief Program. Relief Work for Memons & General Public affected by the lengthy lockdown was also done where Emergency Cash Relief was provided to Memon Families affected by Lockdown. ARY Digital Network also supported WMO in this relief campaign by providing Covid Testing Kits which was much appreciated effort by the CEO Of ARY Digital Network.
- WMO Pakistan and North America Chapters collaborated to jointly arrange Fee Sabeel lillah Collective Qurbani in different cities of Sindh and Baluchistan including Karachi, Hyderabad, Tando Allah Yar, Nawabshah , Sukrand, Sukkur, Thatta, and Hub Chowki. With the pandemic and lockdown, it was difficult to sacrifice cows at the said location, therefore we collaborated with a leading meat exporter having ISO Certification and Shariah Compliance automatic slaughter house in Karachi and it was a successful effort put up by our team.



- One of the core projects of WMO PC is Education where funds are procured and disbursed in a systematic manner to those perusing Higher Education and Education for all where Academic and Vocational Education is provided to Students.
- Since it has been observed that Pakistan is among the highest thalassemia burden countries in the world. We have already planned to gather the data from our community and started working on the prevention but with the pandemic hit situation it became difficult. But we have plans to give awareness sessions, provide screenings, help in the implementation of act passed by the govt of Sindh and to collect the data of Thalassemia Minor and Major.
- WMO PC under the Umbrella of Gift Of Sight has partnered with 2 famous Eye Hospitals of Karachi for the transplant of Cornea to the needy patients. Since the whole procedure of cornea transplant is very crucial and sensitive, WMO has taken all necessary steps for the fulfilment of the whole procedure starting from the shipping process of Cornea at the Airport to successfully transplanting it and the follow up of the said patients.
- The year 2020 was one of difficulties for the entire world, to such an extent that endurance turned into the main human endeavour because of the pandemic which didn't leave anybody independent of identity or monetary conditions. Survival instincts were tried as far as possible. In Pakistan additionally the lockdown influenced all segments of society however especially the educational institutions. This brought about the conclusion of all educational institutions for a time of around 7 months. During this time some experience was acquired through internet instructing. However, when educational program includes 80% practical training, online teaching can have minor effect. The income generation was completely ended however in this situation MITI (Memon Industrial and Technical Institute) upheld their representatives admirably well. It was in October that we at long last limped back to routine life.
- The WMO Rehabilitation Scheme has gotten 7225 applications in 2004. The various applications are themselves verification of the presence of enormous scope in the housing issues faced by the Memon Community in Pakistan. Afterlong consultation and conversation with the Ulmas, WMO began giving flats on possession basis to the destitute families after investigating applications. As of the Year 2020, Total flats provided on ownership were 910, files returned till the year 2020 were 444 and remaining files as of 31st December 2020 were 466. In the year 2020, we had a target to return maximum ownership files, but due to COVID-19, we cannot achieve the target. We hope this target will be achieved in the coming year InshaAllah.

It is our fervent hope that we would be able to implement our vision in the shortest possible time. We owe it to our people to deliver to them what we can. In the same spirit, I would request all our well-wishers to support and encourage us in our right cause. We pray to Allah to give us the strength and capability to achieve the tasks that we have set for ourselves.








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ABOUT THIS REPORT BY THE **Regional Secretary General**

WMO Pakistan Chapter has been working enthusiastically to create new horizons and avenues for the marginalized and the underprivileged of our society, to enable them to live as human beings with dignity. From Education to Health and Housing, WMO exists to address the many causes that affect those around us. Similarly, WMO Pakistan Chapter is dedicated to the rehabilitation of our community providing Learning opportunities, Health Facilities, and better living standards along with disaster relief in the region and more.

- In March 2020, when the Coronavirus began and Pakistan is in the protracted Lockdown, the Office Bearers of the WMO Pakistan Chapter were profoundly worried about the prosperity of Memon families who were subject to everyday earning. The Office Bearers promptly framed the WMOPC COVID-19 RELIEF PROGRAM. Under the relief program, Personal Protective Equipment (PPE) was dispersed to different Government and Private Hospitals, Medicines and Beds were dispersed to Karachi Expo Center's Field Isolation Center. Assistance to Memons and General Public influenced by the lockdown was provided where Emergency Relief cash was given to Memon Families influenced by Lockdown for certain months and Ration was disbursed to Memon Fishermen families in the coastal regions and Islands.
- We are incredibly grateful to all the donors, well-wishers, and volunteers for their support in our cause of sacrificing and distributing Qurbani meat to the deprived families of Karachi, Sukkur, Hyderabad, Thatta, and other towns. We collected funds for 185 cows with the collaboration of the North America Chapter at the occasion of Eid UI Azha.
- By the End of 2020, a number of students have been supported by WMO to accomplish their higher and professional education. The passed out students are now placed in well-known firms and are equally contributing to society with their knowledge and skills. We are extremely grateful to Mid-East Chapter especially Mr. Ahmed Shekhani, our donors and education partners, without whom the WMO Higher Education Support **Program** would not have been successful in helping so many students of the Memon Community and we still request them to keep on supporting us with their generous donations for the fulfillment of our tasks.




- Keeping in consideration the Ailment in the form of Thalassemia and its expensive Treatment ranging from Blood Transfusions, Splenectomy, Deferral Treatments, and Bone Marrow Transplant, WMO aimed to gather data for the thalassemia minor and major patients in our community, spread awareness regarding the disease and prevention of it. During Covid-19 it was a difficult task to collect blood hence the committee organized a blood donation camp with the collaboration of Halar Memon General Jamat at Baghe-Halar hall in the vicinity of the garden area of Karachi. Also arranged some other blood collection camps with the support of various organizations.
- Empowering through Inclusion is one of the projects that stands out while talking about all the projects being run by WMO PC. A very unique event was set up in 2018 with the name "Family Gala with Special Children" this was the first event for special children under a Memon organization. In this event, more than 350 special children were attended, and many private and public organizations were part of the assessment and evaluation of special children. Till the end of 2020, we led numerous meetings for "Early Intervention" and workshops for guardians and instructors, provided consultancies, therapies, tools, and devices to hundreds of special children. However, in 2020 our exciting ride is easing back down because of COVID-19, but our team continuously provided them the best services.

This is our objective to build up or joint hands for a comprehensive Rehabilitation Center for extraordinary children under the banner of WMO, where all type of services are provided under one roof including education and vocational training.

- A Distribution Ceremony of 102 Motorcycles was held at WMO House on various days under the WMO ROZGAR MOTORCYCLE SCHEME to help under privilieged Memon brothers to earn a decent livelihood by seeking employment in various online ride-booking and delivery service companies. Motorcycles were also distributed in Thatta, Hyderabad, and Sukkur. MOU signing with BYKEA was a milestone for this project. Special thanks to manufactures of Unique and Superstar Motorcycles for their support.
- A total of 10 **Regional Management Committee Meetings** took place in WMO House and on Zoom due to the Pandemic.
- 2020 was also the Year of Elections for the Regional Management Committee of the WMO Pakistan Chapter. For the 10 General Seats of RMC, 24 candidates submitted their nominations and for the 2 Ladies Seats, 3 candidates submitted their Nominations. On 29th September 2020, the REC received a withdrawal of nominations from 7 candidates. Later on 7th October 2020, 6 more candidates withdrew their nominations hence the remaining 10 candidates automatically made it to the Regional Management Committee as unopposed members. We look forward to working with them closely with mutual objectives.
- The WMOPC **Rehabilitation Scheme** is one of the largest schemes of WMO, we provided many flats to deserving families under this project. Now we are returning all the original

files to the applicants under SOP.

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

REGIONAL ANNUAL GENERAL MEETING OF **WMOPC**



Since the Covid-19 situation has some what subsided in Pakistan, a physical Regional Annual General Meeting (RAGM) was thus organized by the WMO Pakistan Chapter on Friday, $9^{
m th}$ October 2020 at 6:45 pm at the Rangoonwala Community Centre, Dhoraji Karachi. This RAGM Marked the first large scale event organized by the chapter post covid and was attended by about 84 persons which included Members of the Regional Management Committee (RMC), Trustees, Patron, Life Members, Annual Members, Guests, Representative from Apex Bodies and Institute Members.



The Minutes of the previous RAGM and the Audited Accounts for the year ended 31st December 2019 were approved. Regarding the appointment of Auditors for the year 2020, the upcoming Office Bearers were authorized to appoint suitable Auditors.

During the course of the RAGM the issue of education was raised and discussed. One of

our esteemed and benevolent Trustees, Mr. Muhammad Taufig Amdani Suggest that a Memon University of International Standards be established in Karachi, since this was the dream of Late Haji Abdul Razzak Yagoob (ARY), for which a 100 acres piece of land has already been granted by former President of Pakistan, General Pervaz Musharaf in 2003.

As the idea of the Memon University began to flourish, Mr. Taufig Amdani stepped upto the occasion and announced a donation to PKR 5 Crores (USD 300 Thousand) towards the cause, which would cost approximately PKR 200 crores (USD 12.2Mn).

The WMO Pakistan Chapter's Regional AGM had started on a high note with the Office bearers whole heartedly welcoming the newly elected Regional Management Committee (RMC), Setting the tone for the new year and it ended on an even higher note as the audience witnessed that the dream of a Memon University was close to realization-all thanks to the sublime generosity of Mr. Taufiq Amdani.



A Joint Project of WMO Far East Chapter and WMO Pakistan Chapter



The Gifts of Sight Project of WMO, which was launched in February 2018, aim to provide Gift of Sight by transplant of Cornea to needy patients free of cost. The project


is a joint endeavor with the WMO Far East Chapter.

The WMO has partnered with two very famous Eye Hospitals in Karachi namely Hashmani Eye Hospital and Al Ibrahim Eye Hospital. Al Ibrahim Eye Hospital is dealing with the deserving patients of interior Sindh

and Baluchistan.

In some patients, the cornea gets damaged and hinders clarity of vision. Nowadays, it is possible to replace the cornea via transplant surgery to restore the vision of the patient to a greater percentage of clarity.

We have tried our best to give preference to patients belonging to the Memon Community but cornea transplant cases are not so common in the Memon Community, which is a good sign. However, we have observed cases of Retinal Detachment and Retina related surgeries in the community.

The corneas are shipped from Sri Lanka to Pakistan. After arrives at the Karachi Airport, the WMO Pakistan Chapter takes over and bears all expenses which include clearing at the Airport, safe transportation to the hospital, and costs incurred on the patients for the diagnosis, transplant/ surgery, and post-operative follow-up.

In 2020 due to COVID-19, the number of grafting was very few. We hope in the year 2021 we will achieve the target of 200 Insha'Allah

A cornea transplant (keratoplasty) is a surgical procedure to replace the outermost layer of the eye with a domeshaped surface of the eye with corneal tissue from a donor. Most cornea transplant procedures are successful. But cornea transplant carries a small risk of complications, such as rejection of the donor cornea. A cornea transplant



can restore vision, reduce pain, and improve the appearance of a damaged or diseased cornea and plays an important role in the vision.

	Indications of Corneal Transplant
Optical/Visual	it's the indication in which patients come for improvement in their vision
Therapeutic:	it's the indication in which diseased, infected cornea is replaced with new and fresh donor cornea.
Tectonic:	it's the indication in which eyeball/globe is saved by doing a transplant otherwise patients lose their eyes.
Cosmetic:	it's the indication when there is opacity in a patient's cornea and no hope for vision but patients want the transplant surgery for cosmetic purposes.

Most commonly Optical and Tectonic grafts are done to get the vision improved or to save the eyeball. At Al Ibrahim Eye Hospital, most commonly we did Visual, Tectonic, and a small percentage of Therapeutic grafts.

Result of transplant by Al Ibrahim Eye Hospital:

Advancement in Surgical Procedure:

Corneal Transplant according to recent advancements in technology is further divided into three different layers of transplant in which we can only do transplant of the diseased layer of the cornea as these procedures have a higher success rate than full-thickness corneal transplant.


Type of Layer	Description
Full Thickness Corneal Transplant/ Penetrating Keratoplasty	this is what we are doing very frequently
DSAEK:	two innermost layers are transplanted
DMEK:	the innermost layer is only transplanted
DALK:	Anterior two layers are transplanted

Every procedure has a different indication. Its means we can save at least two and a maximum of three eyes by Single Corneal tissue. But for that advanced technology, equipment is must require such as; high magnification operating microscope, specular microscope, surgical instruments, calibrated vacuum trephines, etc.

34 years old lady came to the hospital to get her eye removed, but her eyes were not removed, and did a tectonic corneal transplant and now she has 40% vision in her left eye.

ELIMINATION OF THALASSEMIA FROM MEMON COMMUNITY

Thalassemia in Pakistan



Pakistan is among the highest thalassemia burden countries in the world. The commonly quoted figure for the country is 100,000 know transfusion-dependent thalassemia patients. In the absence of a coherent national policy and strategic plan, the number of thalassemic in the country is believed to be increasing, but the exact burden of the disease is unknown. As a result, despite being a preventable blood disorder, thalassemia in Pakistan continues to increase in number

and causes misery to the patients and their families. Besides, it also creates a heavy burden on the already resource-constrained and stretched national healthcare system, particularly the blood transfusion system. A significant proportion of the blood transfusions carried out in Pakistan are used for thalassemia patients, but the exact figures also remain unknown. There is a need to better address the thalassemia situation and the concomitant burden on the national health care and blood transfusion systems in Pakistan. As no baseline survey has ever been conducted in Pakistan, there are no credible statistics about any aspect of thalassemia in the country. Basic epidemiological and clinical data about the Pakistan thalassemia population do not exist. Information is also not available about treatment facilities and their access to the patients. Without this basic information, it is difficult to convince the policymakers about allocating resources to control and prevent thalassemia.

WMO is planning to collect data of thalassemia major patient from the community and also desire to work on prevention. In 2019, WMO started the thalassemia project but unfortunately, during 2020 all activities have to close due to COVID-19. In 2021, WMO is planning to work on the following ground:

Awareness sessions

Thalassemia Minor Screening

To work for implementation of Act passed by Government of Sindh in 2013.

To collect data of Thalassemia minor and major

TREATMENT

Two different treatments are available at present, traditional treatment, and Bone-marrow Transplantation.

Traditional Treatment

The traditional treatment consists of three patterns:

1. Blood Transfusion

Blood Transfusion is one of the most regularly practiced treatments for Thalassemia. To be precise, the treatment is not blood transfusion, but transfusion of red blood cells. These transfusions are necessary to provide the patient with a temporary supply of healthy red blood cells with normal haemoglobin capable of carrying the oxygen that the patient's body needs.



Today, most patients with a major form of Thalassemia receive red blood cell transfusions every two to three weeks. There are three reasons for blood transfusions.





- a. To correct anaemia and make sure that tissues get a normal amount of oxygen. This allows thalassemic to live and grow normally.
- b. To let the bone marrow rest, so that the bones can develop normally and do not get deformed.
- c. To slow down or prevent any increase in the size of the spleen.

2. Splenectomy (Removing the Spleen)

When the spleen becomes too active and starts to destroy the red blood cell, transfusions become lesser and less effective. Then it may become necessary to take the spleen out through surgery. This operation is called "Splenectomy".


3. Deferral Treatment

Blood transfusions bring extra iron into the body and if transfusions are regular, iron gradually accumulates in the body. It is stored in certain organs, especially the liver, the heart, and the endocrine glands. The iron behaves like a foreign body, and in the end, would damage the organs where it is deposited. Fortunately, some drugs help the drainage of iron out of the body. The medication used very regularly is Deferoxamine, more commonly called Deferral. Deferral keeps the amount of iron under a safe level in a Thalassemic's body.

Bone-marrow Transplantation

A Thalassemic's bone marrow is not able to make a normal amount of red blood cells. If the malfunctioning bone marrow can be replaced with normal bone marrow, this problem is solved.

At present, only young people with a fully compatible donor can have a bone-marrow transplant.



A transplant in Pakistan (Ziauddin Hospital, Karachi) or India (Apollo Hospital, Chennai) costs the equivalent of \$13,000 to \$14,000 (Pak Rs. 9-10 Lakh). A transplant in any other country may vary in cost.

Life Expectancy

A difficult question perhaps, but Thalassemic's and their families must be aware of this subject. The illness and its

implications are changing almost from day to day, due to advances in treatment. With timely and correct treatment, Thalassemic's live longer and healthier now. It is reasonable to think that people with Thalassemia, well treated from the beginning, may live as long as people without Thalassemia, which means an excellent life expectancy.

Quality of life

A chronic illness always causes some limitation of life, especially when it requires frequent and complex treatment, as Thalassemia does.

But still, the treatment should not be allowed to have a profound effect on a Thalassemic's life. In particular doctors and hospitals should make the effort to arrange out-patients visits for transfusions so that they interfere as little as possible with normal life. Treatment should not interrupt schooling or work. To manage this, some centers arrange transfusions on weekends, others in the late afternoon or at night.

Apart from a few cases, most Thalassemics' lead a normal life. They go to school, take part in social activities and work, get engaged, and get married like everyone else. We are certain that, as time passes, the quality of life will steadily improve.





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
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Report of Education for All Committee



Due to lack of a good academic / Professional / Vocational Education, many generations of the community are facing poverty and have become permanently dependent on Zakat / Donations. To break this cycle of poverty, immediate steps must be taken to attract the younger generation

to acquire the appropriate Academic / Professional / Vocational Education and secure employment/self-employment.

It is observed that the Memon Jamaats have been providing financial assistance for long to financially weak families for education. Due to their limited resources, they could not fulfill the entire need of deserving students' educational requirements causing the dropout of such students at different levels of education.

In July 2008, Education for All Committee" was constituted and in August 2008, the Committee started functioning by calling applications from the needy and deserving families who did not receive sufficient educational help for their children from any source.

WMOPC is focused on three major initiatives:

- i. Ensuring that all the children of school going age must enroll in a school.
- ii. Ensuring that a high school education should result in college readiness.
- iii. Post-secondary education should result in a degree or certificate with genuine economic value.

The objective of the committee is to provide education to the community children whose parents could not afford educational expenses due to non-availability of the funds from Pre-Primary Level to College Level.

A good academic / Professional/vocational education enables the individuals to earn a decent livelihood without which the well-being of the individuals, communities, and countries is at stake. A good academic / Professional/vocational education is a very effective tool in alleviating poverty.

Educated Community is a golden dream of WMO, there are many hurdles to achieve this golden target. We are facing the dropout from girls and boys students, especially after matriculation. The main reasons are as follow:

For the improvement of this relationship, WMOPC already formed a Jamaat Coordination Committee.

Future Plan

- 1. To reduce number of schools
- 2. To shift meritorious students to better schools
- 3. To provide vocational training to the students who could not get education.

Report of HIGHER EDUCATION SUPPORT PROGRAM



WMO started the Higher Education support program in 2004, this was the second project of WMO after the Rehabilitation project. Till the end of 2020, WMO helped more than 1600 students of Higher and Professional Education. The students who have passed out are now well-placed in their careers. The quality of life and financial status of the students has

improved drastically with the positive impact being felt by the whole family. Currently, more than 60 students are enrolled with WMO and are pursuing their studies in different reputed educational institutions of Karachi.

WMO is focused to encourage the youth of the community to get higher education, but we are facing some challenges. Due to currency influence in Pakistan and COVID 19, this is very difficult to pay education fee by white-collar families. It's necessary to adopt an EDUCATION LOAN SCHEME for those students whose families do not want to get ZAKAT. This loan is paid till the end of education and starts to pay off in installment after 6 months of graduation.

On the other side, we observed, due to the current situation, many parents move their children from the education system due to the high amount of fees. WMOPC is sharing Rs. 100,000 per student per annum but nowadays, the average monthly fee is Rs. 20,000 per month which is equaling to Rs. 240,000 per annum. The other costs like conveyance, books, etc. are not included in this amount. We request WMO to increase the budget from 100,000 to 200,000 per annum.

This support has only been made possible with the active support of generous donors. Many reputed educational institutions have also become Education Partners with WMO by offering generous discounts and waivers for students sent by WMO. We are extremely grateful to our donors and education partners, without whom the WMO Higher Education Support Program would not have been successful in helping so many students of the Memon Community. We are thankful to WMO-ME for their generous support for higher education. Our ladies wing is also active and adopting some students of higher education.

We have conduct all group and one-to-one counseling sessions to morally encourage the students and show them the way forward regarding their studies and career. The Committee also strives to get them internships and jobs whenever possible.



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
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Report of REHABILITATION SCHEME

Karachi is the megacity of Pakistan, the majority of Memons are living in this city. Estimated 1.5 million Memons are living in Karachi.

It is distressing to note that a major portion of the Memon population is confronted with numerous socio-economic problems, out of which lack of proper housing is a major issue. Due to the current scenario and the impact of COVID is very serious, many families who were paying house rent, now have to move to smaller flats.

Imagine living in a small house with a large family where the scene outside consists of unhygienic conditions like flowing gutter lines and foul-smelling garbage, infested with mosquitoes and flies. The house from inside is a congested space with grown-up children with electricity playing hide and seek, a leaking roof, and overflowing

bathrooms. The only breadwinner of the family cannot afford to repair or even make the house more comfortable and presentable. This is the typical living condition of most of the poor families living particularly in Old Town and surrounding areas of Karachi.

The cost of flats are now very high, we request to work on "Repair a housing scheme"

The WMO Rehabilitation Scheme has received 7225 applications in 2004. The numerous applications are themselves proof of the existence of large-scale housing issues faced by the Memon Community in Pakistan.

After long deliberation and discussion with the Ulmas, WMO started providing flats on ownership basis to the needy families after scrutinizing applications.



We have set the following categories:

- 1. For single widows living in a rented flat, WMO will pay the monthly rent to deserving applicants.
- 2. Living in Rental Flats
 - a. Widow / Divorcee with a large family
 - b. Large Family with 5 or more members
 - c. Others
- 3. Living in Flats on Goodwill (Pugree)
 - a. Conversion of Goodwill (Pugree) status to ownership status
 - b. Large family having congested accommodation
 - c. Others
- 4. Living in Ownership Flat
 - a. Large family having congested accommodation
 - b. Others

After consulting with renowned Ulemas of the society, the WMO decided to provide flats on a partnership basis with the ownership share of 1% to 5% held by WMO and 95-99% share by the applicant to protect the property of the applicant, who is unaware about the misuse of documents. Later on, it was decided to withdraw the 1-5% share of WMO and hand over the documents of the property to the applicants after 5-10 years, as per policy.

HANDING OVER OF PROPERTY FILES TO THE APPLICANTS:

As per the above commitments, the WMO Rehabilitation Committee has been handing over the original property documents from 2018 to the applicants as per "the original file returning policy". Till the end of the year 2020, we had returned 444 files to applicants, who meet the criteria.

The following policy is adopted for file return:

- 1. To check the legal status of the applicant, if the applicant is expired, the committee guides the legal heirs of the applicant to fulfill the legal process, after which documents are handed over to the legal heirs.
- 2. Property must be free from family disputes.
- 3. If the applicant is selling this flat, the legal status of the new flat is checked



- Names (as per CNIC) along with CNIC numbers were written on the cheques to ensure that the money reaches only the selected beneficiaries.

- Our Banks supported our cause by agreeing to issue payments only after properly matching CNIC Number written on cheque with original CNIC.
- A follow-up telephone call was made to the beneficiaries after a couple of days to find out if all had gone well with the encashment of cheques. Alhamdulillah, the beneficiaries have expressed their satisfaction and have thanked the people at WMO for the timely help.

Report of Distribution of Qurbani Meat

Alhamdulillah,

WMO Pakistan and North America Chapters collaborated with Khadim e Insanyat Welfare International Trust to jointly arrange Fee



Sabeelillah Collective Ourbani in different cities of Sindh and Baluchistan including Karachi, Hyderabad, Tando Allah Yar, Nawabshah Sukrand, Sukkur, Thatta, and Hub Chowki.



We have taken following steps for Qurbani of Cows on behalf of the Donors from Pakistan and North America:

- 1. Cash and via online funding.
- 2. Full cow received from Donors.
- 3. Direct Qurbani by Donors and supply of meat at our specific locations.



Due to COVID and the Sindh Government restrictions, it was difficult task to sacrifice cow at compound near Khadim e Insaniyat office in Karachi, therefore, we decided to sacrifice 100 cows through a leading meat exporter, having an ISO certification and Shariya compliance automatic Slaughter-House in Karachi. Alhamdulillah it was a successful experience and we have learnt a lot to cater more donors in future.



The process of sacrifice (Qurbani) of cows is remarkably interesting, It started in the evening of Eid day in front of our team. All cows gathered in a yard in batches at the end of the yard. The cows pass through a very narrow passage having width of passing one cow, where all cows stand one after another making a que automatically.



From the narrow passage, one cow at a time enters in a box to a holding machine, specially made for holding the sacrificial cows. As the cow entered in the box, the names of the Sacrificing Donors are called here. Then the box turns up using hydraulic pressure pump. The neck of cow came down towards the person, who is ready to (Zibah) cut its neck using sharpened knife with the Takbeer Allah o Akber in one go.

Thereafter, the cow automatically hangs by its legs on conveyors by Hook system. There are few stations in the plant along the conveyors for further process like removal of skins, removal of unnecessary organs and fats.



After the Qurbani of cow, the cow passes through following steps through conveyors:

- 1. to remove the skin and head of the cow.
- 2. to remove the big and small intestines, unnecessary organs and fats from the stomach.
- 3. to cut the cow in four pieces by cleaning the meat with pressurized water.
- 4. to get the weight of all 4 pieces through computerized scales passing through the conveyors, tagging the names of donors and weight of the meet of the cow.
- 5. to shift the cow meat to cold storage to keep the meet at certain temperature to keep it fresh for few hours.
- 6. to cut the meat into small pieces for consumption in the kitchen.
- 7. to pack it in plastic bags with 2.5~3.0 kg meat in each bag.
- 8. to keep all bags in a tray of 10 bags capacity
- 9. to keep the meat trays in freezers again for distribution to clients.



- 10. to send the meat trays to client's premises through Reefer Vans
- The last process is at our end. The meat trays were unloaded from the Reefer Vans and transferred to area wise transport managed to distribute the meat bags to the homes of families, who are unable to eat meat, even on Eid ul Azha due to their financial status.
- This year, our team of WMO NA, WMO PC and Khadim e Insaniat have sacrificed 185 cows in Karachi and interior of Sindh as under:
- Karachi: 100 cows at Slaughter House.9 cows at our centers, 14 cows' gurbani meat from donors distributed at our locations.

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The Year 2020 in the Perspective of the Pandemic

H. M. Shahzad, Chairman MITI

I am pleased to present here an Overview of the performance of the Memon Industrial and Technical Institute for the year 2020.

At the outset, I wish to pay tribute to the memory of the one person without whose vision Memon Industrial and Training Institute (MITI) wouldn't have come into being. That person was none other than, Haji Abdul Razzak Yagoob Gandhi (ARY). We must also remember the support of the then City Nazim, Mr. Mustafa Kamal. I am also grateful to all my colleagues in WMO-PC, past and present who have always been supportive of my efforts in making MITI a model vocational training center. But mainly I have been ably supported in my work by the MITI team led by Mr. Shahab Hasan, C.O.O.

The year 2020 was one of challenges for

the whole global community, so much so that survival became the most important human endeavor due to the pandemic which did not spare anyone irrespective of nationality or economic conditions. Survival instincts were tested to the limits. In Pakistan also the lockdown affected all sections of society but particularly the educational institutions. This resulted in the closure of all educational activities for a period of almost 7 months. During this time some experience was gained through online teaching. But when curriculum involves 80% practical training, online activity can have very minor impact. The income generation was totally halted but in this scenario we supported our employees as best as we could. Our funding partners also shut down their activities. So we lost two complete batches of our vocational training. It was in October that we finally limped back to normalcy. Needless to say we suffered badly financially also having lost the enrollment of almost 6000 students. The funding partners have restarted their activities and the year 2021 promises to be one of restructuring renewal for the students as well as for the Institute and staff.

The challenges notwithstanding, there has been strict compliance of the WMO principles of charity, welfare and service to humanity. MITI fees are still highly subsidized for all but free for those who cannot afford even that. MITI is destined to achieve bigger goals in the future for uplifting of the lives of the less fortunate youth of society. Alhamdulillah, we have been well received by the various funding agencies and during this period, we worked as training partners with almost all national and international agencies such as NAVTTC, GIZ, BAT, UNDP, USAID and others.



I must bring to your kind notice that MITI is equipped with the latest technology equipment and highly qualified teachers but is charging very nominal fees from students including many full scholarships in line with our charter of welfare and charity. This does not even cover our expenses. I therefore appeal to you all to give your generous donations or zakat to MITI especially for its future development plans.

May Allah guide us and help us in achieving the high welfare targets which we have set for ourselves.



Expansion and Renovation of Facilities

By the grace of Allah, MITI has completed 9 years of operation. In these 9 years, we have served more than 96250 students. The graduating students have been well received by the industry locally as well as internationally which is due to hard work and commitment of the management and our faculty team. To achieve these objectives, our workshops and other facilities were purpose built to satisfy the training needs of the time. To keep up with the time and

The time has now come when we are faced with the reality of the following:

1. Addition of new equipment:

Many of the equipment and facilities have become old while new ones have not been added. The present facilities are falling behind the requirements and advancements in industry.

Computer hardware is another big area which requires up gradation. Our computers are no longer compatible with the software that are now available and have become standards of the industry and which we are teaching. So far, we have been coping with these requirements by local up gradations but this has a limit. This includes all the computers in our classes as well as the servers in the I.T. room.

2. New Courses

To remain competitive, it is necessary to keep pace with the needs of the students and employers and introduce new courses from time to time. We have not introduced any new course in the last 2 years. We badly need to begin the following courses which are demands of the industry:

Industrial Electronics Instrumentation Fashion Marketing & Merchandizing Auto body Refinishing Alternate Energy

3. Expansion of Facilities:

Besides the academic needs, there are needs of building and facilities.

Our power bill is very high. The only solution is to go solar. This solution is most economical in the long run but initial investment is high. We require USD 100,000 for this project.

The fiber glass roof is leaking badly and needs to be replaced. We also need a fully functional and well equipped Auditorium.

Report of Empowering through Inclusion Project

A Joint project of Pakistan and North America Chapter



EMPOWERING THROUGH INCLUSION A JOINT PROJECT OF WMO PAKISTAN AND NORTH AMERICA CHAPTERS

Review by the Chairman

WMOPC started the Education for All Project in 2008, from day one, WMOPC supporting special children for academic education. In the year 2018, WMOPC conducted a very unique event with the title "Family Gala with Special Children" This was the first event for special children under a Memon organization. In this event, more than 350 special children were attended, and many private and public organizations were part of the assessment and evaluation of special children. We observed that:

- 1. Most special children are being treating by MBBS doctors.
- 2. Most parents do not know their kids may be treated by a specialist.
- 3. Many parents are not aware of the actual issue of their kids.
- 4. Many parents do not know about the way of treatment of their kids
- 5. Due to illiteracy and false beliefs, some parents do not provide the proper treatment.
- 6. The deprived families can not afford the cost of treatment or education.

After reviewing the above points, WMOPC decided to conduct an assessment and evaluation session for the registered special children who are getting support for education from WMOPC. Fortunately, WMONA is agreed to support for assessment. (a detailed report of 2018 and 2019) already published in Performance Report)

The assessment and evaluation was started in 2019, During this session, we met many parents of special children and decided to increase the scope of this project. On the suggestion of WMONA, we named this project "Empowering through Inclusion" with the vision "To reduce the difficulty of special children and their families" and started to work for the rehabilitation of special children.

Till the end of 2020, we conducted many sessions for "Early Intervention" and workshops for parents and teachers. But in 2020 our roller coaster is slowing down due to COVID-19.



It is our target to establish a holistic rehabilitation center for special children under the flag of WMO. Currently, we are trying to start a "Children Development Unit" and trying to collaborate with rehabilitation centers.

Alhamdulillah, till the end of 2020, we registered 171 special children and provided various services which include; consultancy, medication, lab tests, treatments, therapies, etc.

SECTION: HEARING AID AND SPEECH THERAPY



It is very common to use glasses to cover visual impairment, With glasses, the person is a normal person and doing all works easily. Like this if we provide hearing aid to a deaf kid with complete rehabilitation and required treatments, the deaf person will be a common person with a one year struggle. Generaly, with hearing aid they need speech therapy for one year to complete rehabilitation. This life change action will change the life cycle of the family and the deaf person and society.

A hearing aid is a device designed to improve hearing by making sound audible to a person with hearing loss. Hearing aids are classified as medical devices in most countries and regulated by the respective regulations.

Many families with deaf children cannot buy hearing aids due to the high cost, so their children face a lot of problems in practical life. It's necessary to provide hearing aid with related services to deaf children which enable them to lead a normal life.



To provide this medical device, the age factor is more valid. All the benefits are dependent on the age of special children. On the other side, if children are by birth deaf, it has a different scenario than a person who is deaf due to some accident.

WMO-ETI is providing a Behind The Ear (BTE) hearing aid. BTE hearing aids consist of a case that hangs behind the pinna. The case is attached to an ear-mold or dome tip by a traditional tube, slim tube, or wire. The tube or wire courses from the superior-ventral portion of the pinna to the concha, where the ear-mold or dome tip inserts into the external auditory canal. The case contains the electronics, controls, battery, and microphone(s). The loudspeaker, or receiver, may be housed in the case (traditional BTE) or the ear-mold or dome tip (receiver-inthe-canal, or RIC). The RIC style of BTE hearing aid is often smaller than a traditional BTE and more commonly used in more active populations.

To provide the best services to deaf persons, ETI arranged a meeting with the experts on 15th September 2020 at Peads Department of Liaguat National Hospital to discuss the matters of hearing impairment, hearing aid, speech therapy, and related matters and set an SOP

A Hearing Aid is a very important device for hearing loss persons, but the benefits of a hearing aid are varied case to case, some may get full benefits but some may not. So, to understand the process and benefits of providing hearing aid and its SOP, ETI arranged a meeting with valuable professionals. It was a very fruitful meeting and we gained knowledge about the use of Hearing Aid. We also understood that the hearing aid is not a magical device; it's a medical device and has advantages and disadvantages.

The following process was set for the cases of hearing impairment:

- 1. Registration
- 2. Initial Assessment of patients by Clinical psychologists for diagnosis of suspected neurodevelopmental disorders including the level of disability and recommendations needs to cope them to estimate the extent of benefit after using hearing aid through cognition testing.
- 3. Check up with a Neurologist to evaluate if any brain dysfunction involves (Seizures Disorder etc.)
- 4. Physical examination through ENT specialist to diagnose the etiology of hearing loss including type and other medical factors.
- Evaluate by an Audiologist, to conduct tests like BERA, ASSR, etc. Audiologists will also be responsible to manage and treat hearing loss and related damages. Also, deal with different areas of cochlear implant and hearing aids including the post services, and provide awareness and a booklet about precautions.

We adopted one of the following tests for the checking of hearing loss level:

a. BERA : Brainstem Evoked Response Audiometry

b. ASSR :Audiometry Steady-State Response

c. PTA : Pure Tone Audiometry

d. Tympanometry : Middle Ear Test

Mostly we are using ASSR and PTA technology.

- 6. We also distributed guidelines "How to maintain a hearing aid" to all beneficiaries in Urdu. Also arranged a briefing session for the caretakers.
- 7. The speech Therapist will work to improve speech level, according to standard criteria the most favorable conditions are:
- Patient with early intervention (0_5 years) .
- A person with accidental hearing loss.
- A person with congenital hearing loss using hearing aids from the beginning.
- Can work with Post-Linguistic Hearing impaired but not with Pre-Linguistic hearing impaired.



8. Follow up as criteria already decided before through volunteers.

Type of treatment:

Listening and spoken language	2. Auditory oral and auditory speech therapy
3. Total communication speech therapy	4. Cochlear implant candidacy

Speech Treatment

Speech therapy typically starts after the child has been fitted with appropriate hearing technology. Hearing-impaired speech treatment sessions typically last one hour, the child must arrive with a hearing device in good working order.

The child will be scheduled with a therapist based on his or her ability to communicate. The primary caregiver should sit in during the session and join in as guided by the speech pathologist.

The speech pathologist will give goals and targets to work at home. During the session, the caregiver should take notes to know what

to work for the following week. The carry-over of goals into the home setting is essential for a child's progress.





Lesson plans are created for the child's level and needs. The caregiver will know how a child is doing during each session. Goals are created to address a child's speech, language, listening, cognitive, and literacy development Materials are often provided for home practice and carry-over when needed. This was discussed that currently ETI has more than 25 applications for hearing Aids and expecting more applications. This was finalized

to start the procedure for providing Hearing Aids and the target was set 30 hearing aids till the end of December 2020.

Distribution of 26 Hearing Aids



In Feb 2020, we were working to provide hearing aids to deaf and mute children. At that time we got 25 applications for hearing aids, unfortunately, this was not finalized due to COVID-19. From October 2020, the activities resumed.





We distributed also 'how quidelines, maintain hearing aid' all beneficiaries in Urdu, All hearing aids are under warranty for 6 months, we briefed the patients about after-sales service and the importance of its regular maintenance.







We provided hearing aids to beneficiaries, but It does not end, now we need to follow these cases and ensure that the beneficiaries are hearing the voice and also work for their speech. After one / two weeks, the beneficiaries will be familiar with the device, then we will send them to a speech therapist and maybe send to a behavior therapist. The checkup of the device is necessary ervery 3 months cycle. All parents are instructed to visit the provider quarterly. Our Volunteers Mrs. Ainy Naveed, Mrs. Ambreen Bilal, and Mrs. Farhana will follow them and will contact them at least once a week.

<u>Distribution of hearing aid and briefing session with the parents</u>

PHYSIOTHERAPY AT HOME

On the recommendation of doctors, we plan to start physiotherapy at home. This was necessary to know the actual position of each patient who needs physiotherapy. Therefore we called all our physio-recommended patients for comprehensive physio and orthopedic checkups. This session was held at WMO House from 10:00 am to 4:00 pm on Saturday 19th Sept 2020. In this session, arranged an evaluation to review and understand the need for Physiotherapy and to work for their therapy plan.

Our All children were already checked by various doctors and on their suggestion, we invited 25 special children. 18 were attended and the professionals evaluated them. After the evaluation of 18 children, 15 were approved to start their physiotherapy and 3 referred for further Orthopedic checkups by Dr. Amin Choniey at Indus Hospital.

We observed that the movement of special children especially CP and Ortho patients is very difficult. If they want to go for physiotherapy or anywhere, they face the following challenges:

- 1. To come down from the flat of a multi-story building.
- 2. To arrange transport.
- 3. To sit properly in this transport (Mostly Rickshaw)
- 4. Due to road conditions face a lot of shocks during travel.
- 5. At the destination, to come out from Rickshaw. (Difficult)
- 6. To walk on the pathway of the clinic/hospital.
- 7. After therapy, return home.
- 8. The cost of travel is also a matter, which is at least Rs. 600 for one round trip. Most patients need at least 3 therapies in a week which cost is about Rs. 1800 per week, and Rs. 7800 per month, which is not affordable for the parents.





On the other side, due to COVID, many physiotherapy centers are closed. Based on the above scenario, It was decided to provide physiotherapies at home. After long deliberation, it was decided to start work on a contractual basis and after gaining good experience, we should hire some physiotherapist at project roll.

On the suggestion of Mr. Abdul Razzak Pardesi, the committee assigns this job to Mr. Misbah, owner of "Proficient Physiotherapy Center"









It was decided to prepare an evaluation report along with therapy and a follow-up plan by the volunteer team. Mr. Misbah will start his visit from Monday 21st Sept 2020 at the home of special children and will provide a comprehensive therapy plan before the end of September.

On 3^{rd} October the volunteer team and Mr. Misbah met and finalized the therapy plan. The physiotherapy started at home in October 2020.

Tools provided



Sadia physical and mentally disabled, we already provided tailor-made chair to her,

and today we provided AFO (Ankle Foot Splint) and WHO (Wrests, Hand Splint) for hand and leg support. We are also providing physiotherapy at her home.

Hamid, Physical and Mental disabled, can't move, we provided a tailor-made The professional chair. team evaluated him and decided to start work for his rehabilitation and



provide physiotherapy at home.

TahirisIDD(Intellectual Development Disorder) In this pix Mr. Fakhar is measuring his foot for making AFO.

Aysha Faisal: We already provided her a special chair now we provided her KAFO (Knee, Ankle, Foot Splint). She is suffering from Myelomeningocele (the spinal cord and nerves develop outside of the body and are contained in a fluid-filled sac that is visible outside of the back area. These babies typically have weakness and loss of sensation below the sac)



Aftab, Physical and mental disabilities, brother of Hamid. He also can't move. We are planning to provide a tailormade chair to him

and to start physiotherapy at his home.



Umm-e-Hani

Deaf and Mute, we again providing Hearing Aid, her hearing aid was misplaced during the



heavy rainfall when she was in the Market with her mother.









Special tailor-made all in one Chair for Arsalan Baber with many facilities like Seating, Dining, Toilet, Standing, Sleeping, Comfort



Distribution of Special (Imported) Wheel Chair to Ayesha at WMO House on Friday 17th July 2020.

When Ayesha was 5 days old, her spinal cord was operated upon. When she was 18 months, her parents knew that she could not stand. Now she is 6 years old.

Parents contact us in July 2020 and we sent her to consultant Dr. Raman Kumar. Now her treatment is underway.

Initially, we have provided her with a multipurpose imported special chair. This will be beneficial for her and her parents for easy movement.

On the advice of the consultant, we also provided HKFO (Hip, knee, foot Orthosis) for her size. This tool will Support her to stand and walk. This is a long time process followed by various therapies and a one-year follow-up. We hope she will start her walking within a year. In due time we are working to enroll her in formal school, but due to COVID, it is a very difficult task.

SURGERIES

Taimoor Ali was just one and a half years old, a tragedy happened. His mother was boiling water for drinking purposes. She was not aware that Taimoor was crawling near her feet. While she was removing the pot of boiling water from the stove Taimoor was exactly under her feet causing her to stumble and drop the pot. The boiling water fell on the baby and it was terrible. Taimoor's skin was scalded to a great extent and tissues of his arms and shoulders fused.



The parents took their baby to a government hospital that gave him emergency treatment. The doctors said that any other treatment can be done only when the child grows up a bit. It was a great daily turmoil for the parents and Taimoor because not only were there great scars on the entire left side of the body, Taimoor could not move his left arm much and experienced great pain on moving or lifting his arm.

Recently, someone referred Taimoor to WMO Pakistan Chapter for remedial and plastic surgery. Dr. Mazhar Nizam of Patel Hospital has



suggested POST BURN CONTRACTURES OF THE LEFT AXILLA AND LEFT ARM, He planned the release of contracture in two stages inhaling of axillary contracture than the Elbow Contracture. It may even take up to three sessions.

His first surgery was done on 3rd December 2018, after the first surgery Taimoor can lift his arm with ease. Another surgery was due in March 2020 but unfortunately due to COVID-19, it's delayed. On 17th August 2020, his second surgery was done at Patel Hospital.

Taimoor is 10 years old and studying only in Class I. But he has great aspirations for the future and wants to join the army. He loves to play Hide & Seek with his friends and has an elder brother and an elder sister




Surgery Saira

Alhamdulillah, the **ANKYLOSIS TMJ RT** surgery of Saira Hazoor is done successfully on 23rd August 2020 at Liaquat National Hospital, Karachi.


Saira was five months old, her elder brother, who is a few years older than her, was sitting at the top of a staircase with Saira in his lap. Very unfortunately, the little Saira fell off from his lap and slide down the stairs



on her face.



But the real results began to show up only when Saira was about two years old. Her lower jaw was found to be damaged and her teeth were deformed. For this reason, Saira could not open her jaws properly or chew food and had to be fed with liquids only. The doctors diagnosed that her mandible (lower jaw) was deformed and had deviated to the right side and the ramous of right hamimandible appears wide.



Kumar of Liaquat National Hospital, where her treatment plan was finalized. He referred her to PNS Shaifa for Maxilla Facial Surgery and advised them to visit Dr. Nasir Jamal, the surgeon of <u>Oral and Maxillofacial</u>. The cost of surgery is nearest to Rs. 200,000.



The surgery date was fixed for March 2020, but unfortunately due to COVID-19, the date was postponed, and finally, her surgery was done at Liaquat National Hospital.

PEDIATRIC CARDIOLOGY CLINIC

Many children with down syndrome are also facing a cardio problem, to understand the matter we met with the following valuable personalities on 16th July 2020 at Liaguat National Hospital:

- 1. Prof. Dr. Mehnaz Attig (Pediatric Cardiologist).
- 2. Dr. Raman Kumar (Peads Neurologist).
- Younis (Pediatric 3. Dr. Kamran Cardiologist)
- 4. Mr. Saleem Musani
- 5. Shoaib Ghaziani
- 6. Tehmina Kadim



It's a noticeable point that the Pediatric Cardiologist and Pediatric Neurologist are very few in Pakistan and Alhamdullilah in our team we have 2 peads cardiologists and one peads neurologist.

Discussed pediatric Cardiac issues in Special Children. Both Cardiologists ensured their full support for the treatment of special children.

After this meeting, we sent many special children for a cardio checkup.

SPECIAL COMPUTERIZED NATIONAL IDENTITY CARD (SCNIC)

Federal and Sindh Government is offering many facilities to the person with disabilities if they registered with NADRA as special children status also called "Special Computerized National Identity Card (SCNIC).

This is one of the objectives to provide services to "Persons with Disabilities" for SCNIC Status (PWD marked on CNIC or B Form). We assigned this task to Mr. Faroog Bakali and Mr. Amin Bhamba. In this regard, Mr. Faroog Bakali visited the office of the Directorate of Sindh Special Education to understand all the procedures and got all information.

This is necessary for all disabled persons to collect disable certificate and based on this certificate NADRA will process the SCNIC.

After the various meeting with the Directorate of Sindh Special Education, the following SOP was finalized:

- 1. This offer is valid for PWD of all communities and religions.
- 2. The target is at least 200 applications.
- 3. Provide Guidelines to the applicant about the requirement.
- 4. Collection of required documents.
- 5. Review all documents and if find any discrepancy, fix it.
- 6. Allocate a suitable day to gather all registered PWD for assessment and process to SCNIC by the regularity team and NADRA.

This was finalized to arrange a three days ONE WINDOW camp in the last week of May 2020 at our selected location. The Regularity team and NADRA will check all the documents and will complete all processes for the issuance of SCNIC. Due to COVID, this was postponed, and a new date was set in November 2020, but this was also postponed and now the new date is set in June 2021.





VOLUNTEER FORUM



WMO is supporting many needs special children, devices, we provide the tools, consultancy, and other supports, but it's very difficult to know the perfect use of these facilities, after discussion we decided to form a volunteers' forum. We have two main domains for follow-up: One is the patients

with Hearing Aids and speech therapies and the other group is the patients who are getting physiotherapies.

We appointed four mentors - Mrs. Ainy Naveed, Mrs. Erum Aijaz, Mrs. Ambreen Bilal, and Mrs. Farhana - to work as volunteers. Each of them will monitor five hearingimpaired children and counsel their families. As well four mentors - Dr. Igra Hameed, Ms. Faryal Irfan, Ms. Faheema Irfan, and Mr. Sheryar Khan will monitor the beneficiaries who are getting physiotherapy at home.



1. Mentors will coordinate with the special needs children and their families at their places either by personal visits or by telephone and WhatsApp.



- No need to repeatedly visit the WMO office. 2.
- 3. They will look after the progress of PWD and follow up on the treatment plan.
- 4. They will report to Project Director on regular basis.
- 5. They will call at least once a week to the caregiver of PWD.
- They should visit WMO once a month to discuss the 6. status.
- They should meet with PWD along with his/her mother guarterly (three months).
- The Executive members will meet with these volunteers quarterly.
- 9. In case of any complex, they should contact the Project Manager.

REHABILITATION CENTER

This is a desire of the committee to collaborate with a rehab center, which can provide all types of services under their supervision. In this regard, we discussed with many organizations and institutes.

From the beginning of this project, we met "Center of Inclusion Care" (CIC), they are providing only some therapies and specialist in psychology. Then we connected with Liaquat National Hospital, they had a very unique setup namely "Peads Development Unit (PDU)" with a good



We also met with the following:

ZUBAIDA MEDICAL CENTER

During January and February 2020, a Chain of the meeting was held with Mr. Javed, Chairman Zubaida Medical Center, Mr. Rehan Bandukra, Dr. Asad CEO of ZMC, Mr. Kamran Taloo, and others as well the representative of ETI was Shoaib Ghaziani, Qasim Lawai, Dr. Raman Kumar, Razzak Pardesi, Mr. Faroog Bakali, and Dr. Muhammad Ali.

The objective of these meetings was to establish a "Child Development Unit" at Zubaida Medical Center for special children to provide all treatment facilities to the special needs persons.

Finally, the following points were agreed upon:

- 1. ZMC will establish a complete unit with the title "Child Development Unit" to facilitate children under 8 years. This unit will be run by our team member Dr. Raman Kumar.
- 2. ZMC will be allowed a 25% zakat allowance or 10% non-zakat discount to all patients referred by WMOPC.
- 3. ZMC will allow a 60% discount for physiotherapy at ZMC.
- 4. ZMC also agreed to start other therapies very soon.
- 5. Physiotherapy and other treatment for WMO special children at a discounted rate.
- 6. To establish Children Neurology Clinic at ZMC.
- 7. Inpatient facility for deserving patients' referred by WMOPC.
- 8. To establish an Executive Clinic.

A child Development Unit is based on a complete assessment of a child by a Neurologist, psychologist, and various therapists and experts. In February 2020, the Neurology clinic was started and the department of speech and occupational therapies also started. ZMC already had a physiotherapy department and the appointment of a psychologist and other concerned staff was in process. This was a good start to facilitate the special children of WMOPC at one window. Unfortunately from March 2020, the COVID-19 disturbed all the systems and till the end of 2020, this project was not completed.

Imran Rehabilitation Centre (IRC)

This center is running a rabilitation center for special children providing some therapies and education. They have a very good building, expert for CP children. Having a capacity of 150 students, we decided to send here our one group of 24 special children to this center for education next year. Based on experience, we may increase the number of students.

Institute of Holistic Rehabilitation and Inclusion

Mr. Abdul Razzak Pardesi is running a rehabilitation center in Zambia, Africa, in December 2020, he started his first center in Karachi to provide holistic services under one roof. He also introduces Cage Therapy, some new therapies included hydrotherapy in this center. He offered various services to ETI. At initial, he offered the evaluation of 60 special children. But unfortunately, due to COVID, his center could not be started in 2020. We hope this will starts in 2021

These include intake of 15% new students, improvements in the SOPs and new Software Development in light of the recommendations expected from Mr. Ashraf Usman, who is currently conducting a Diagnostic Review and Organizational Development of the Education Schemes at the Chapter.

The Adopt a Child for Education is the brainchild of the WMOPC Ladies Wing. A committee will interview students and, on approval, will recommend the student for adoption/financing for the rest of his or her education in the best of educational institutions.

Regarding the Empowering through Inclusion (Special Children) Project, it is planned to detect more special children and consequently increase the number of children for treatment and therapies.
