

The Rozgar initiative undertaken by **WMO Pakistan**Chapter firmly underlines our belief – "give a man a fish and you feed him for a day; teach a man to fish and you feed him for a lifetime"

For over a decade now, the Rozgar Scheme has been achieving its objective of enabling the recipients to earn a livelihood, sustain their families, provide their children with an education thus ensuring a life with dignity.

Over the years, hundreds of **auto rickshaws** and thousands of **sewing machines** have been distributed under the Rozgar Scheme to the marginalized Memon families of Pakistan.

This year WMO aims to deliver **250** vehicles including auto rickshaws, motorcycles and motorcycle

loaders to deserving families at an average cost of a **\$1000** (thousand dollars) per vehicle. But with a slight modification to the scheme of things.

This will be a Lillah project.

WMO expects the program to not only earn a livelihood for the recipients but we expect the donee to give back a fraction of his earnings to WMO. The funds received would be once again utilized to donate vehicles to other underprivileged members of the community thus making the program self sustaining and giving it the ability to reach out to a larger strata of the marginalized in Pakistan. More importantly the recipients would eventually become proud donors and the program would achieve the prime objective of delivering dignity of life.

The Battle Against Forced Cremation

THE BATTLE AGAINST FORCED CREMATION IN SRI LANKA

omen say there is no greater pain than to bear a child. We say there is no greater pain than to bury one. And then there is the mother of the 20 day old Shaykh who went through the tumultuous cycle of child birth and child loss in a blink of an eye. And she couldn't even bury her child!

Shaykh was the latest and youngest victim of Covid-19, cremated against his family's wishes, courtesy the Sri Lankan government's inhumane policy of forced cremation of all people who succumb to the virus, irrespective of their religious beliefs.

Sir Iqbal Sacranie, former Senior Vice President of the World Memon Organisation has launched a tireless crusade against the forced cremation of Muslims, who have succumbed to the Corona outbreak in Sri Lanka.

It is a blatant violation of the religious freedom, beliefs and human rights of the minority Muslim community in Sri Lanka, as Islam stipulates that the dead must be buried. In an articulate interview to the **ARY channel**, Sir Iqbal expressed his views and demanded an immediate reversal of this horrific cremation policy that is causing abject distress to the minority Muslim community in Sri Lanka

Sir Iqbal was also the founding Secretary General of the **Muslim Council of Britain (MCB)**, an organization that has pursued this pertinent matter with unabated dedication and passion.

A taskforce set up by the MCB had written to the **Sri Lankan high commissioner** in the UK demanding an immediate reversal of the unjust cremation policy. This was followed by mounting a legal challenge against the policy and bringing this pertinent matter to the urgent attention of the **United Nations Human Rights Committee (UNHRC)** for a swift resolution.

The Muslim Council of Britain also called upon the UN to halt forced cremations in Sri Lanka and submitted

a formal complaint to the UNHRC, urgently requesting the suspension of the policy. Sir labal is spearheading the initiative and garnering support from several heads of states and Governments across the globe who are standing steadfast with the crusader.

As the Muslim World comes together and stands in solidarity with our brethren in Sri Lanka, the World Memon Organisation applauds our stalwarts - Sir Iqbal Sacranie and **President Salman Iqbal** for their tireless endeavours against the unprecedented injustices being inflicted on our brothers and sisters in Sri Lanka.

At length, on the 10th of February, **Prime Minister Mahinda Rajapaksa** announced in parliament that permission will be granted for the burial of COVID-19 victims. Once it is gazetted it will officially reverse the dreaded policy which has been implemented in Sri Lanka since March last year.

After months of relentless pressure by human right organizations, United Nations experts, medical professionals in Sri Lanka, Muslim leaders and community organisations from across the globe, the Sri Lankan government has finally conceded.

It also brought our crusader at the doorstep of a resolute victory. When asked for his comments on the heartening news, Sir labal stated "Praise be to Allah - wonderful news. Let's continue to pray that the Sri Lankan government formalises the change of policy which will bring huge relief to Muslims and other faith communities in Sri Lanka. Finally, they can bury their loved ones when they die according to the practice of their Deen."

He continued," I am immensely appreciative of the kind messages and duas received from so many but it must be made clear that it was the collective efforts of many individuals and organisations across the globe who supported the campaign wholeheartedly that has yielded positive results.

"I am particularly very pleased that every Memon I approached in different countries gave unequivocal support and undertaking to carry out the lobbying in their countries. I must record my deep appreciation for a number of individuals including our WMO President Salman Iqbal for his fullest, unconditional support. Chairman of the WMO Board of Trustees - Mr. Ashraf Sattar, the Sri Lankan contingent of Ilyas Admani, Shiraz Yunus, Rafik Kassim and Hanif Yusuf for their

remarkable persistence.

Mr. Satar Dada and Gulaam Abdoola from Botswana. Mr. Solly Noor, Haroon Kalla, Adil Assamo and Feizul Ayub from South Africa for effective lobbying with their governments. Mr. Shoaib Kothawalla from the US who galvanised support in his neck of the woods. Dr Shiraz Suleman and Senator Ravalia from Canada for raising the issue in the Canadian Parliament. Dr Ashfaque Tayob and Khalid Dawood of Portugal for taking up this pertinent matter with the UN. Mr. Iqbal Yusuf Japanwalla from Japan, Farouk Valimahomed & the entire MCB team from UK, along with many other Muslims and non Muslims who assured me of their unconditional support and guidance.

Many worked relentlessly behind the scene. May Almighty Allah reward each one of them abundantly for their efforts to help bring relief to the Ummah in Sri Lanka."

We appreciate the statement from the Premier of Sri Lanka and await its implementation. Until then WMO continues to stand firm, shoulder to shoulder with Sir Iqbal Sacranie and our Muslim brethren in Sri Lanka.

On the 23rd of February, the honourable **Prime Minister of the Islamic Republic of Pakistan** visited Sri Lanka amidst protests by Muslims who vehemently demanded burial rights. **Prime Minister Imran Khan** raised the pertinent matter with his counterpart in Sri Lanka and within **48** hours the policy was gazetted.

On the 25th of February the Minister of Health Extraordinary issued - the Gazette **Notification** amending the regulations of the **Quarantine** Prevention Diseases of **Ordinance** allow burial of those that succumbed to the virus.

Mr. Salman Iqbal - President of the World Memon Organisation played a pivotal role and emphasised to Mr. Imran Khan that this important matter be raised on his official visit to Sri Lanka. A gesture testament to the good will and camaraderie shared between the two leaders.

It is a moment of great pride for the World Memon Organisation as our leaders have been on the frontline in this battle against forced cremations in Sri Lanka.



WMO COMBATS COVID SURGE IN INDIA

The devastating second wave of the Corona pandemic has ravaged India, overwhelming healthcare facilities, leaving despairing families scrambling to source oxygen, medicine and hospital beds for their loved ones.

The World Memon Organisation India Chapter has been on the frontlines as the nation battles a rampant pandemic.

Oxygen is the most precious commodity in India today. Most fatalities have occurred due to steep falls in oxygen levels in the body, leaving patients gasping for breath. High capacity oxygen cylinders, oxygen concentrators, bipap machines, breathing apparatuses and oximeters have been delivered to the ailing.

Covid Centers have been established in various cities, towns and villages to ease the suffering. Each centre is under expert medical supervision, has an inexhaustible supply of oxygen and life saving medicines. Along with free treatments, the centers stock essential food items which are provided to the afflicted and their families.

Monetary Assistance in the form of payment of hospital bills and insurance policies to cover medical expenses have been availed for the needy.

Vaccination Drive

An aggressive campaign has been conducted by the Chapter to accelerate the Vaccination Drive in India. Free vaccines have been administered to residents of several cities, towns and remote villages. 

Covid Centers

The devastating second wave of the corona pandemic has led to the collapse of the healthcare system in India.

The first of many Covid Centres to be set up by WMO North India Chapter has been established in **Surat**, Gujarat.

Sufi Sarvjanik Hospital in Surat has been converted into a Covid Centre to cater to those infected by the virus. Under the

medical supervision and devoted care of the existing doctors and dedicated nurses of the hospital, WMO aims to provide the best treatment at zero costs for the afflicted.

Stock piles of Oxygen cylinders, breathing apparatuses, essential medical equipments including oxygen concentrators, bipap machines, ventilators and life saving medications have been delivered to the centre so that nobody is turned away in their hour of need.

Free food is also served at the centre to the recovering patients and food packs are being delivered to their families to tide over the crisis.

Similar covid centres have been established in Jasdan and **Himatnagar** in the state of Gujarat.

WMO has created 15 more centres, especially in small towns and villages as rural India is gasping for breath, choking under the fatal grip of the pandemic.

Vaccination drive in Baroda

On the 3rd of July, a vaccination drive was organized by the World Memon Organisation North India Chapter in Baroda. Baroda is the second largest city in the Indian state of Gujarat.

The event was a collaboration between WMO, the Baroda Muslim Doctors Association, the regional Memon Jamaats and the local administration.

The Morbi Tankara Hall served as the venue and was swarming with people since the early hours of the morning. By the end of the stipulated hours, almost 600 vaccine jabs were delivered.


The contentious religious site has withstood the fury of nature and its walls have stood undeterred to several hostile attacks over the years. But now they are in urgent need of maintenance and repairs.








Mr. Salman Iqbal - the Cricket Connoisseur


Salman Iqbal's love for cricket is an open secret but to fathom the depths of his love for the game, you have to be among his inner circle of lifelong friends.







Ambojwadi

The slums of Ambojwadi are the last refuge for a sizeable Muslim population, living in abject poverty in the western suburb of Mumbai.

The Zeal Education and Welfare Trust runs a community kitchen and provides meals to the many children and families that reside in these squalid conditions.

The Ladies Wing of WMO North India Chapter under the leadership of Mrs. Raziya Chashmawala, partnered with Zeal and visited the slums to deliver hot meal boxes to the gathered children.

Africa



Indeed.


KwaZulu-Natal


Two Months of the Food Bank in South Africa



As usual she stood on the frontlines, braved the onslaught and assisted the victims in rebuilding their lives.


