





It was this innate feeling that impelled me to join WMO in its formative years together with my mentor and idol Haji Abdul Razzak Yakoob ARY and since then I have been working to achieve his mission and that of the other founding fathers. It is



undoubtedly an honour for me to serve this prestigious organization once more after a gap of 3 years as the Regional President. I am committed to give my best effort to accomplish these objectives which are not new to me, having served as the Secretary General and Regional VP in previous years also.


2020 was the year of the pandemic and the sole activity was that of survival. Alhamdulillah, we were able to keep doing our work in whatever small way possible for the community. The year 2021 was however the year of rehabilitation, renewal and fight back and with the Grace of Allah we were supported in our endeavors as always by our donors who helped us get back up on our feet.

Given below is a brief description of the activities carried out by the WMO-PC in the year 2021. The details are given by the respective Chairmen of our various committees who carried out their work with zeal and commitment:

• WMO Pakistan did Fee Sabeel lillah Collective Qurbani in different cities of Sindh and Baluchistan including Karachi, Hyderabad, Tando Allah Yar, Nawabshah, Sukrand, Sukkur, Thatta, and Hub Chowki. Almost 100 cows were sacrificed as Qurbani and the meat was distributed in all the under privileged areas of Sindh.

• One of the core projects of WMO PC is Education in which donations are distributed in a specific way to the students pursuing Higher Education. On the other hand, "The Education For All" program supports families in providing primary and secondary education to their children. Besides, Vocational Education is also available for the Students. We have increased our budget for education considerably where higher education is provided to all those applying and the spectrum of "Education for all" is also enhanced from 6500 in 2021 to 10,000 in 2022. Special measures have been taken to implement the educational policies which will definitely be an aid to the students.

• Under the leadership of Mr. Salman Iqbal and Mr. Mahmood Shaikhani WMO launched their enormous project of Food Bank to provide food for the needy persons which was also simultaneously run in all the other chapters of WMO. Alhumdulillah WMO Pakistan Chapter has managed to extend the Food Bank Program in the areas



• WMO has been supporting the needy families in terms of their monthly ration since a few years and with all the misfortune due to 2 Years of Covid, it was nearly impossible for many families to run their households. WMO has raised the amount in order to facilitate those families. Along with this they have also increased their budget of the Rentals provided to the Indigent families.

• Like last year, WMO PC under the Umbrella of Gift of Sight Program continued its partnership with famous Eye Hospitals of Karachi for the transplant of Cornea to the needy patients. Since the whole procedure of cornea transplant is very crucial and sensitive, WMO has taken all necessary steps for the fulfilment of the whole procedure starting from the shipping process of Cornea at the Airport to successfully transplanting it and the follow up of the patients.

• The WMO Rehabilitation Scheme has been working since 2004 when it started its activities and received more than 7000 applications. The large number of applications was in itself confirmation of the fact that there was a large scope of working to resolve the housing issues faced by the Memon Community in Pakistan. After long consultation and deliberations, WMO began giving flats on possession basis to the destitute families after investigating their bonafide requirements. As of the Year 2021, total number of flats provided on ownership basis were almost 910, files returned till the year 2021 were almost 451 and remaining files will be completed in 2022. We fell behind our target due to COVID-19, but we hope our target will be achieved in the coming year Insha'Allah.


• Memon Industrial & Technical Institute has been doing wonders since many years and we make sure every day and night that it reaches greater heights. As the lockdowns ended, MITI also resumed normal working and we were able to enroll almost 8000 students in the year. Last year MITI also completed the project of "Ray of Hope" which was supported by the TVET Sector Support Program funded by European Union and at its completion, a mega Job Fair was arranged where different activities took place under one roof and many students were given chances to meet their future employers. Besides that, we continuously strive to introduce new courses and programs for the students to benefit from and different collaborations are taking place with funding bodies and Industries to facilitate our students.

It is my prayers and hope that Allah swt may bless us with the strength and acumen to implement our vision within the shortest time possible. We owe it to our people to supply to them what we can. In the identical spirit, I request all our well-wishers to assist and inspire us in our cause. We pray to Allah to present us the power and functionality to complete the responsibilities that we have set for ourselves.



Meanwhile we have also taken special measures to Ensure Quality Education to the needy and bright students. Some new reforms have taken place and we hope them to be beneficial equally to the donors and WMO PC. Pakistan Chapter is also simultaneously working with all other Chapters to make Food Bank a Huge Success. Our President Salman Iqbal's Initiative is already prospering across the continents and Pakistan Chapter is making every possible effort to take Food Bank to every nook and corner of Pakistan. The Disastrous 2 Years of Covid have made it very difficult for the people to run their households, WMO PC is working on this course of Action and they are supporting the families in terms of monthly ration and their rentals. We have also increased our budget for this initiative and we are trying our best to support the indigent families.

We will be initiating our Rozgar scheme from non-zakat collections in which our donors and well-wishers are supporting us to the utmost and have committed to give their best support financially to support the white collars of our community.

Coming to our financial figures for the year 2021, our collection for WMO PC was around Rs. 201,779,567. This was majorly spent on Lower & higher education projects, the amount spent being Rs. 142,072,357. Another project which have a high spending is Mahana Madad, which is 24,380,000. As we all know WMO PC like all chapters started Food Bank in November which in this short period have spent Rs. 771,051. Hence WMOPC spent around Rs. 198,485,178 on various projects. Our office expenses around to Rs. 7,776,397.

Report of GIFT OF SIGHT

A Joint Project of WMO Far East Chapter and WMO Pakistan Chapter

This project is a joint venture between WMO Far East Chapter and WMO Pakistan Chapter The cornea is the transparent outermost layer of the eye with a dome-shaped surface and plays an important role in vision. In some patients, the cornea gets damaged and hinders clarity of vision.

Due to modern science, it is possible to replace the cornea via a transplant surgery to restore the vision of the patient to a greater percentage of clarity. Even one cornea can be replaced with 3 patients.

The Gift of Sight Project of WMO, which was launched in February 2018, aims to provide free of cost transplants of Cornea to deserving patients.

Currently, we are working with AL Ibrahim Eye Hospital, a state-of-the-art hospital having all facilities for eye care.


- 1. The Cornea is collected by the WMO Far East chapter from Sri Lanka Eye Donation Society, transported by air to Karachi, and all the costs from Collection to Karachi Airport bear by Far East Chapter.
- 2. After the cornea arrives at the Karachi Airport, the WMO Pakistan Chapter takes over and bears all expenses, including Clearing at the Airport, safe transportation to the hospital, and costs incurred on the patients for the diagnosis, transplant/surgery, and post-operative follow-up.
- 3. WMO has partnered with Hashmani's Eye Hospital, and Al Ebrahim Eye Hospital
- 4. The cost is increasing day by day, the approximate cost of this project on WMOPC comes to PKR 15 million, which is based on approximately 250 surgeries at the rate of PKR 60,000 per surgery.
- 5. Funding for this project is sufficient and there is no immediate need for funds. We are pleased to announce that the Gift of Sight Project is one of the most self-sufficient projects of WMOPC.
- 6. 260 cases have been treated as of 31st December 2021.
- 7. We have tried our best to give preference to patients belonging to the Memon Community but cornea transplant cases are not so common in the Memon Community, which is a good sign.
- 8. However, we have observed many cases of Retinal Detachment and Retina related surgeries in the community. The major cases are related to Cataracts, Alhamdulillah, we have now started cataract surgery and till the end of 2021 we handled 50 cases.

REPORT OF ELIMINATION OF THALASSEMIA FROM MEMON COMMUNITY



The objective:

- 1. to collect data of thalassemia major patients
- 2. To identify the thalassemia minor families.
- 3. Awareness sessions
- 4. Thalassemia minor screening
- To work for the implementation of the ACT passed by the Government of Sindh in 2013.
- To provide the best treatment to Thalassemia major patients.
- 7. To work on bone-marrow transplantation.
- 8. Blood collection camps for thalassemia major



The bone marrow of thalassemia major is not able to make a normal amount of red blood cells. Alhamdulillah, we discussed this with the Managing Director of Gambit Hospital, Sindh, and 400 km away from Karachi. This hospital is providing all services for bone-marrow transplants. We offer them a filter clinic in Karachi and also asked for a quota. The cost of a bone-marrow transplant is about to Rs. 2.5 million.



REPORT OF EDUCATION FOR ALL COMMITTEE

WMO PC works by supporting schools, children and their families to raise achievements by promoting high level of Education. The service works through whole school approaches, and by providing early intervention and targeted support to pupils and families by extending their access to all levels of Education so that they may build their future by securing good jobs.

It was witnessed that the Memon Jamats were providing monetary assistance for long to financially weak households for schooling. Due to their constrained resources, they could not satisfy the entire requirements of the needy families resulting in dropout of

such college and School Students to a large extent. In order to curb this situation, "Education for All" Committee was formed in August 2008. The Committee started functioning by calling applications from the needy and deserving families who did not receive sufficient educational help for their children from any source.

For the improvement of the project goals, WMOPC has started a Jamat partnership scheme. Alhamdulillah almost all Jamaats willingly became partners of WMO PC and now we are jointly struggling for the benefit of the students. For further improvement of this relationship, WMO PC formed a Jamaat Coordination Committee which is doing a commendable job.

After taking all Jamaats on board, the Number of Students have been almost doubled. The Number of students have increased from 3500 to 6175. With this increase we have also started working on our budget and we plan to increase the amount from 24,000 to 30,000 per Annum for Every School Going Child and for Every College Student we plan to increase the amount from 48,000 to 60,000 Per Annum. To maintain Transparency between the Donors and the Committee, we have started working on developing a software to make it a Paperless Procedure. The Pilot Testing is in the pipeline and we hope to launch the Software within a few months this will help us to compile and maintain the data of the students, donations, schools on one Platform and the parents work will also become hassle free since they won't have to fill forms every now and then.

We have also taken measures to decrease the number of schools on board and provide quality Education. To fulfil the purpose, we are working on Cambridge System Education to be provided to the children.





REPORT OF HIGHER EDUCATION COMMITTEE

Higher education is the key to success & Gateway of financial transformation of families.

2021 Early 2004, the Higher Education Support Program is running smoothly and till the end of 2021, WMO helped more than 1700 students to get higher and professional education. The students who have passed out are now well-placed in their careers. The quality of life and financial status of the students has improved drastically with the positive impact being felt by the whole family.



Current year 133 students have been provided financial assistance

from WMOPC for Higher Education to various universities and for different courses such as CA, ACCA, ICMA, MBA, BBA, B.com, BSC, D-Pharm, M.Com, MBBS etc etc.

The cost of education is very high and increasing day by day. It is necessary to increase the fund, at present, WMOPC is contributing Rs.100,000 per student per annum. On request of the community, office bearers of WMOPC increased the fund from 100,000 to 150,000 but it's still not enough as the average monthly fee is Rs.25,000 per month which is equaling Rs.300,000 per annum. We recommend increasing this fund up to Rs. 300,000. The other costs like conveyance, books are not included in this amount.

SUPPORT FOR PURCHASE OF FLAT

We must work for those who are living on rent. The rental cost is equivalent to one month salary of an unskilled person. If we provide them a small flat they may be removed from Zakat distribution List.

In this year, we had a target to return maximum ownership files, but due to COVID-19, we could not achieve the target. We hope this target will be achieve in 2022 Insha'Allah.



REPORT OF DISTRIBUTION OF QURBANI MEAT

During 3 days of Eid ul Azha 1442 (2021)

Alhamdulillah,

Since last three years, WMO Pakistan and North America Chapters are working jointly to arrange **fee Sabeelillah.** Collective Qurbani in different cities of Sindh and Baluchistan including Karachi, Hyderabad, Tando Allah Yar, Nawabshah, Sukrand, Sukkur, Thatta, and Hub Chowki.

We received fund through cash and online for Qurbani of cows on behalf of the donors from Pakistan and North America.

Team of USA showed very keen interest to



sacrifices cows before morning of 2nd Eid as their morning was the evening in Pakistan. This was a difficult task. But Alhamdulilah, we achieved this target and sacrificed 89 cows before 7:00 pm in Karachi, through a leading automatic slaughter house who is a meat exporter, having an ISO certification and Shariya compliance. Alhamdulillah it was a successful experience, our team also in touch with the President of WMONA and update him time to time.

The process of sacrifices (Qurbani) of cows is remarkably interesting, it started in the evening of Eid day in front of our team. All cows gathered in a yard in batches, at the end of yard, the cows pass through a very narrow passage having width of passing one cow, where all cows stand one after another making a que automatically.

From the narrow passage, one cow at a time enter in a box belong to a holding machine, specially made for holding the sacrificing cows. As the cow entered in the box, the names of the Sacrificing Donors are called here through a list provided by our team. Then the box turns up using hydraulic pressure pump. The neck of cow comes down towards the person, who is ready to (Zibah) cut its neck using sharpened knife with the Takbeer Allah o Akber in one go.

Thereafter. The cow hangs by its legs on conveyors by Hook system. There are few stations in the plant along the conveyors for further process. After the Qurbani of cow, the cow passes through following steps through conveyors:

- 1. To remove the skin and head of the cow. To remove the big and small intestines, unnecessary organs and fats from the stomach.
- 2. To cut the cow in four pieces by cleaning the meat with pressurized water.
- 3. To get the weight of all 4 pieces through computerized scales passing through the conveyors, tagging the names of donors and weight of the meet of the cow.

- 4. To shift the cow meet to cold storage at certain temperature to keep the meat fresh for few hours.
- 5. To cut the meat into small pieces for consumption in the kitchen.
- 6. To pack it in plastic bags with 2 ~ 2.5 kgs meat in each bag.
- 7. to keep all bags in a tray of 10 bags capacity
- 8. To keep the meat trays in freezers again for distribution to clients.
- 9. to send the meat trays to client's premises through freezer Vans
- The last process is at our end, the meat trays were unloaded from the freezer vans and transferred to area wise transport managed to distribute the meat bags to the homes of families, who are unable to eat the meat, even on Eid ul Azha due to their financial status.

In the year 2021, we offered to all Jamaats to collect fund and purchase the cow at their discretion and sacrifice at their place, but due to COVID, Jamaats could not work on this ground in Karachi but many Jamaats collected meat packets from WMO office on second day.

In Karachi, the hygienically packed bags of sacrificial meat were distributed in Gadap Town, Baldia Town, Orangi Town, Gulshan Town and Saddar Town.

We are incredibly grateful to all the donors, well-wishers, and volunteers for their support.

Special thanks to respected Bashir Akuli RP of WMONA and Respected H.M. Shahzad RP-WMOPC, Mr. Altaf Habib Jangda RSG- WMOPC, Mr. Arsalan Nara RT-WMOPC for their tremendous support. We are grateful to the entire team of WMOPC for their dedicated work during two Eid days of Eid.

The success was not possible without the support of our team leaders Mr. Qasim Lawai (representing WMO NA), Mr. Taufiq Ahmed Ghaziani and Asif Qureshi and all other Volunteers.

Year 2021 – The Fight Back – Restructuring & Renewal



H. M. Shahzad, Chairman MITI

It is my privilege to present here the various aspects of the performance of the Memon Industrial and Technical Institute in the year 2021.

I will be failing in my duty if I proceed further without remembering at the outset, the one person without whose vision Memon Industrial and Technical Institute (MITI) wouldn't have come into being. That person was none other than, Haji Abdul Razzak Yaqoob Gandhi (ARY) whose vision has benefitted more than 100,000 students to date. We must also remember the support of the then City Nazim, Mr. Mustafa Kamal And all my colleagues in WMO-PC, past and present who have always been supportive of my efforts in making MITI a model vocational training center. But mainly I have been ably supported in my work by the MITI team led by Mr. Shahab Hasan, C.O.O.



Whereas the year 2020 was one of challenges and survival, the year 2021 was one of rehabilitation and fight back. We started this fight back with resolve and determination to get back our lost ground. Our funding partners had also shut down their activities. So we lost two complete batches of our vocational calendar. It was in October 2020 that we finally limped back to normalcy. Needless to say we suffered badly financially also having lost the enrollment of almost 8000 students. However, by the Grace of Allah we were able to enroll almost 8700 students in 2021. The funding partners have restarted their activities and the year 2021 was one of restructuring and renewal for the management as well as for the whole staff. The outlook for the future is good.

These challenges notwithstanding, there has been strict compliance of the WMO principles of charity, welfare and service to humanity. 





MITI prides itself in becoming a premier institution for vocational training in the country and the management and staff of MITI are committed in its continued growth to help the destitute people of society for upward mobility.

We are humbled by the achievements and are grateful to Allah SWT for guiding us in the right direction and giving success in our ventures.

Expansion and Renovation of Facilities

By the grace of Allah, MITI has completed 9 years of operation. In these 9 years, we have served more than 96250 students. The graduating students have been well received by the industry locally as well as internationally which is due to hard work and commitment of the management and our faculty team. To achieve these objectives, our workshops and other facilities were purpose built to satisfy the training needs of the time. To keep up with the time and The time has now come when we are faced with the reality of the following:

1. Addition of new equipment:

Many of the equipment and facilities have become old while new ones have not been added. The present facilities are falling behind the requirements and advancements in industry. Computer hardware is another big area which requires up gradation. Our computers are no longer compatible with the software that are now available and have become standards of the industry and which we are teaching. So far, we have been coping with these requirements by local up gradations but this has a limit. This includes all the computers in our classes as well as the servers in the I.T. room.

2. New Courses:

To remain competitive, it is necessary to keep pace with the needs of the students and employers and introduce new courses from time to time. We have not introduced any new course in the last 2 years. We badly need to begin the following courses which are demands of the industry:

Industrial Electronics Instrumentation Fashion Marketing & Merchandizing Auto body Refinishing Alternate Energy

3. Expansion of Facilities:

Besides the academic needs, there are needs of building and facilities.

Our power bill is very high. The only solution is to go solar. This solution is most economical in the long run but initial investment is high. We require USD 100,000 for this project.

The fiber glass roof is leaking badly and needs to be replaced. We also need a fully functional and well equipped Auditorium.

Your valuable contribution in this cause is the dire need of MITI which can rightly be called the flagship project of the World Memon Organization.

REPORT OF EMPOWERING THROUGH INCLUSION PROJECT

WMO strongly believes that if enough love, care, therapy, training, and tenderness are extended to children with special needs, it will enable them to grow up as normal adults with the dignity and respect they deserve in a World that once thought they were different.

The Empowering Through Inclusion Project is running since 2019 with the collaboration between WMO Pakistan Chapter and WMO North America Chapter. It supports more than 200 special need children of different age levels. No doubt, we may change the socio-economic condition of many children suffering from their disabilities.

Since day one, we are providing the following services:

- 1. Consultancies, Audiology, Cardiology, Neurology, etc.
- 2. Lab Tests included MRI, CT, BERA, etc
- 3. Medication
- 4. Tools and devices, including wheelchairs, hearing aids, knee mobilizers, etc.
- 5. Occupational and Physiotherapy at home.
- 6. Speech, behavior, and other therapies from the various center.
- 7. Caretakers (Parents) Rehabilitation program
- 8. Ramadan Ration and Qurbani Meat
- 9. Eid Gifts, comforts, Blankets, ladies' suits, etc.

Our observations in the light of experiences are as under:

1.How to identify:

- a. Awareness is the basic key. If parents are aware of the problem, the matter is controllable.
- b. Schools are very important to identify the special needs. If schools identify at an early stage, the lives of children may be converted from special to normal in many cases.
- c. Newborn baby screening is necessary, it results in the betterment and reduces the burden of special need children and parents by up to 40%.
- d. It's clear that we can improve the lives of special need children if parents are aware and bring the child to a specialist at an early stage.
- e. It also needed to be aware the doctors to refer any abnormal cases to the specialists.

2.How to improve:

- a. The special children under 8 years are more controllable than the elders. If age is less, the result may be better.
- b. Some need tools and devices to better their lives, like wheelchairs, hearing aids, and other required tools. If we provide the required equipment, they can move from special to the mainstream.
- c. Some declared special children are not special needs, they have some muscles problem that can be solved by medication and physiotherapy.
- 3. Our target should be to improve their life skills or at least stay at the current level.
- 4. Government should implement the rules passed by Cabinet.


