

2. RAMADAN, EIDUL FITR & EIDUL ADHA 2022 THE PRE-RAMADAN FEEDING PROGRAM, A COLLABORATION BETWEEN WMO AFRICA CHAPTER AND CAPE TOWN MEMON ASSOCIATION EXPANDED TO MANY IMPOVERISHED AREAS OF THE WESTERN CAPE PROVINCE.

2.1. On the **20th of March 2022**, the pre-Ramadan feeding program distributed 800 food packs to the underprivileged in Wellington.

2.2. On the 26th of March 2022, the pre-Ramadan feeding program continued in several impoverished areas of the Western Cape Province. Invisible Hands, a charity on the frontlines of feeding Capetown's most vulnerable, came on board to prepare a nutritious noodle broth. Each meal ended up costing just
2 Rands and more than 5000 deprived individuals, mostly malnourished children were fed for a mere R10,000.



2.3. On the **27th of March 2022**, Doors of Jannah partnered on the community outreach program as akhni, a traditional Memoni delicacy of rice and meat, cooked at the Worcester masjid was distributed to the marginalised.

2.4. On the **29th of March 2022,** Invisible Hands, a charity on the frontlines of feeding Capetown's most vulnerable, came on board to prepare a nutritious noodle broth. A single cauldron feeds 400 and several

cauldrons were transported to areas in Cape Town where people gathered in large numbers in anticipation of their next meal.

WMO Africa Chapter has requested a Moulaana to conduct personal home visits to assess each case and submit a detailed report to the Committee. The Moulaana is compensated for his time and services. Strict criteria have been put in place to ensure that all cases are legitimate and genuine. This process has been working well and we hope to continue the service for those families who are in need.

8.WMO AFRICA YOUTH WING REPORT BY SADAF VAHED

Since July 2022, the WMO Africa Youth Wing has been rekindled under the leadership of GYW Chairperson Khurram Kalia. In May 2022, Sadaf Vahedna was appointed as interim head of WMO Africa Youth Wing with the primary objective and mandate to help the African Chapter of the WMO attract more youth to join and participate in activities under the Global

Youth Wing of WMO. Historically, the Youth Wing in Africa has been small in size with limited activities and involvement from local youth in the community. Potential youth members in the community were

phoned individually by Sadaf Vahedna over the course

of June 2022 to tell them about the WMOs activities

and global youth initiatives and invite them to join asactive members. Youth were also invited to attend the annual Africa AGM in July 2022 to hear about all of the Global Youth Wing's Initiatives and to consider participation. These activities led to over 100 youth being added to the WMO Africa Chapter's network in under 3 months.



8.1. KEY PILLARS OF GYW AND THE STRUCTURE OF THE AFRICAN YOUTH WING

In August 2022, Sadaf Vahedna was officially appointed as the Regional Vice Chair of GYW Africa (RYVC) In order to get the youth in Africa engaged and involved, regular meetings have been held over Zoom since July 2022, where all youth are welcome to attend, hear about the work being done in the Youth Wing and contribute. The structure and strategy of the African Youth Wing has been envisioned and implemented by RYVC, Sadaf Vahedna with the blessing of the GYW Chairperson.



8.2. PHILOSOPHY AND CORE BELIEFS BEHIND THE WMO'S AFRICAN YOUTH WING

All activities conducted by the African Youth Wing must be done with long term outcomes in mind. This approach re-enforces long term accountability in the mindsets of the youth. Furthermore, as the youth of the community, it is fitting for youth to take up projects with positive long-term outcomes, especially as we live in a world of instant gratification. With this philosophy at the core of the African Youth Wing, different teams were set up with divided roles and responsibilities. In order to streamline the Youth Wing's activities, an organisation structure was created an put in place. This structure was based on the key pillars and the purpose defined by the Global Youth Wing Strategy.




The key pillars of the Global Youth Wing and their purpose are found below:





8.3. TEAM FORMATION

After hosting a virtual Zoom meeting which was open to all Memon youth to attend, the structure of the youth wing was explained along with potential projects and tasks that each team would be responsible for. The teams were grouped in order not to overburden any youth volunteers, many of which had indicated time constraints. It was also noted that different youth had different interests and splitting up the groups as such would allow youth to focus on their areas of passion. Based on feedback from youth, youth were placed into groups. Each team was tasked with completing a project every quarter. This approach allows for each team to work at their own pace while ensuring that general youth members are engaged consistently.




8.5. WEBINAR SERIES – MAKING CRYPTO LESS CRYPTIC

In August 2022, Team Engage, led by Sadaf Vahedna organised a webinar series for WMO youth all around the world. The purpose of the event was to educate WMO youth members about the basics of cryptographic technology, how it works and why it is important for the youth to understand the use cases of this powerful technology. The two-part series had the following attendance from around the world:



- Part 1: 128 unique active views
- Part 2: 104 unique active views

This event gave WMO African Youth exposure to the other chapters in the world. Had many non-members attend the event allowing us to showcase the WMO Youth Wing's activities. We were also able to build a database through registrations for the event. 238 people registered to attend with many people asking to the recordings of the video to be shared post the event. The recordings are part of the WMO Youtube Channel and will allow the WMO to continue getting exposure online.



8.6.WMO2- TREE PLANTATION PROJECT

WMO Global Youth Wing issued a mandate to plant three million trees across the world. In South Africa, we have decided to plant trees at community sites (such as schools, clinics and community gardens) in underprivileged areas. This project is being executed by Team Enable, under the leadership of Mohamed Moti. Our hope is that these trees will directly benefit those communities and community members in addition to the benefits tree planting has on the broader environment.

PLANTING HAS BEGUN AT 5 SCHOOLS IN SOUTH AFRICA www.wmoworld.org

We have partnered with organisations that have the expertise to do the tree planting as well as assist with ongoing monitoring and evaluation. Our focus on monitoring and evaluation is a hallmark of our project, as we are not merely hoping to put trees in the ground, but rather, we are hoping to grow trees – thereby ensuring the full benefit of this initiative is realized. Our partnerships as well as the specific planting parameters are in place to give the trees the best chance of survival.

Thus far, we have planted trees with two organisations: The Precious Tree Project (PTP) based in the Western Cape and the Khuthaza Foundation (KF) based in Gauteng. Each site's particular needs are assessed before planting takes place. Part of the assessment is the number of trees to be planted and the particular mix of indigenous and fruit trees. Fruit trees are more expensive than indigenous trees. Our pricing estimation of R250/tree applies only to indigenous trees.

TOTAL OF 293 TREES, TOTAL COST OF R87 868.75 AVERAGE COST PER TREE R299.89



The project was launched on the 16th of September 2022, our first planting took place less than a month later on the 13th of October 2022.

The tree planting activity conducted by the Precious Tree Project (PTP) involves the following two components:

1) A 15-minute discussion regarding the general benefits of trees, fruit trees and the importance of fruit in a healthy diet.

2) Group tree planting – the students are placed in groups according to their grade and have the opportunity to work together to plant trees in preselected locations on the school grounds.

The learners will be participating in a "care and maintenance" regime, whereby each class will be responsible for looking after the tree they have planted and an outdoor class activity will revolve around the growth, care and development of their trees.

Please Note: the learners will not be solely responsible for the tree's survival, the "care and maintenance" activity is more for the student's ongoing educational benefit as part of the Natural Sciences curriculum, there are grounds men responsible for the upkeep of the trees. Our planting slowed down towards the end of the year as students were involved with their end of year exams and then schools were closed for the December holidays.



To date we have received a total of R235 950.00 for this project.

We are intending to continue our planting with the Precious Tree Project (PTP) in the Western Cape and to begin collaborating with Reel Gardening (RG) in Gauteng. Our collaboration in Gauteng will see beneficiary schools receiving: 35 fruit trees donated by the WMO as part of the WMO2 project, a school library and vegetable gardens donated by Hyundai – planting and maintenance of the vegetable gardens and fruit trees to be done by Reel Gardening.

8.7. YOUTH WING COFFEE MORNING – EFFECTIVE CHARITY DISCUSSION

The WMO Youth Wing & Members of the Africa Chapter hosted a Coffee Morning event on the 10th December 2022. We were inspired by a very engaging presentation on How to do Charity Effectively by Mathew Truscott - a professional who heads humanitarian policy for one of the largest non-profits in the world. The group was buzzing with interactive discussion regarding effective charity and how we, as donors and volunteers could play a role in improving inequality systemically in society. Participants were each given cookies with a hidden question inside- encouraging them to ponder and share their thoughts with the group.

9.6. KZN FLOOD RELIEF BY WMO AFRICA CHAPTER IN COLLABORATION WITH NATAL MEMON JAMAAT AND JAMA'ATUN NISAA

Our Chapter remains committed to work within the Constitution of WMO and that is to serve the communities we live in and humanity at large.


