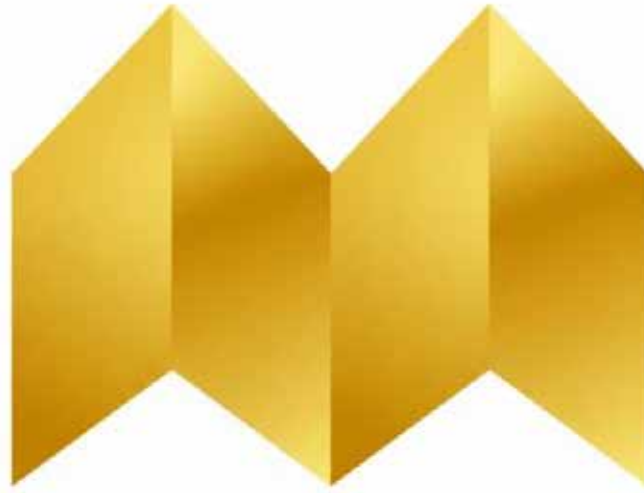

ANNUAL MEMBERS MEETING OF WMOPC

The Annual Members Meeting (AMM) of the World Memon Organisation Pakistan Chapter (WMOPC) was held on Saturday, 27th September 2025 at 6:30 p.m. at Karachi Club Annexe, Karachi. The meeting was attended by 65 participants, including Office Bearers, Trustees, Patrons, Life Members, Youth & Ladies Wing representatives, Apex Bodies, Guests, & Observers.

The meeting commenced with the recitation from the Holy Qur'an followed by the National Anthem. During the session, the Annual Performance Report and Audited Accounts for the year ended 31st December 2024 were presented to the members. The Minutes of the previous Annual Members Meeting were unanimously approved. Mr. Musaab Mansoor, Regional Treasurer, presented the audited accounts, which were subsequently approved by the house. The members also authorized the Office Bearers to appoint auditors for the year ending 31st December 2025.

During 2024, WMOPC continued its commitment to education, rehabilitation, welfare, & community development through the following major initiatives:

- **Education:** Disbursed approximately Rs. 210 million under the Education for All Program & Rs. 25 million for Higher Education, supporting thousands of deserving students across Pakistan.
- **Rehabilitation:** Spent Rs. 12.5 million under the Rehabilitation Program & successfully completed 97 housing assistance cases. The Housing Project was also revived with the support of the WMO Middle East Chapter.
- **Flood Relief:** Successfully concluded the Flood Relief Project with expenditures exceeding Rs. 50 million, providing continued support to flood-affected families.
- **Family Upliftment:** Provided financial assistance and livelihood support to deserving families through the Family Upliftment Program.
- **Membership Development:** Enrolled 38 new Life Members, further strengthening the membership base of WMOPC.
- **Youth Wing:** Successfully organized various leadership, community service, & youth engagement initiatives while expanding participation among young members.
- **Ladies Wing:** Continued its active role in welfare, education, and community development projects, making a significant contribution towards WMOPC's social impact.
- **Financial Performance:** Collected approximately Rs. 320 million in Zakat Funds & Rs. 10 million in Non-Zakat Funds, ensuring transparent and effective utilization of resources through independently audited accounts.

The meeting concluded with appreciation for the efforts of all volunteers, committee members, donors, sponsors, Youth Wing, Ladies Wing, and staff members who contributed towards the success of WMOPC programs and activities throughout the year.

EMPOWERING THROUGH INCLUSION A - CHANGE-OF-LIFE INITIATIVE FOR CHILDREN WITH SPECIAL NEEDS

(Reyaz Ahmed)

The Challenge

Children with special needs (SNCs) require individualized care, rehabilitation, & family support. In Pakistan, many children do not receive timely diagnosis or intervention because parents lack awareness, mothers struggle with acceptance, referrals are delayed, treatment costs are high, assistive devices are limited or poor in quality, and conditions such as muscular weakness are sometimes misdiagnosed even though timely therapy can significantly improve outcomes.

Our Response

To bridge these gaps, the project “Empowering Through Inclusion” was launched in 2019 as a life-changing support program for children with special needs and their families.

Services Provide

- Specialist consultations: Neurology, Audiology, ENT, Cardiology, & other consultations through Liaquat National Hospital, MMI, Jamal Noor Hospital, and partner hospitals.
- Diagnostic tests: MRI, CT scans, BERA, X-rays, and other screenings through MMI.
- Assistive technology: Provision of wheelchairs, hearing aids, knee mobilizers, & other supportive devices.
- Home-based therapies: Occupational and physiotherapy services provided through IHRI.
- Rehabilitation and education: Speech therapy, behavioural therapy, special education, & related services through rehabilitation canter.
- Caregiver training: Education and hands-on training for parents and caregivers.
- Family support: Ramadan ration, sacrificial meat distribution, Eid gifts, blankets, ladies' suits, and comfort support for families in need.

Impact so far

- 270 registered children by the end of 2025.
- Faster access to specialist care, including five weekly appointments with paediatric neurologist Dr. Raman Kumar with only two days' notice.
- Support from a strong consultant panel, including Prof. Dr. Mukhtar Singapori (ENT), Dr. Kamran Younus (Paediatric Cardiology), and Mr. Aamir-ur-Rehman (Audiology).
- Visible improvements in children's daily functioning & reduced burden on mothers & caregivers.

Research initiative: “Understanding – Special Needs Children”

In 2024, a research-based extension of the project was launched. Community Health Workers (CHWs) receive eight days of intensive training and then conduct at least two home visits per month for one year. They train caregivers in handling SNCs and provide basic support and monitoring at home.

Early intervention priorities

- **Neonatal hearing screening**
Hearing loss in newborns can often be identified between the 5th day after birth and 3 months of age. Early screening is a cost-effective intervention that improves speech, language, and developmental outcomes. The project seeks to acquire a screening device costing approximately Rs. 2.5 million to offer free newborn hearing screening services through trained audiologists.
- **Prediction of cerebral palsy**
Early identification of cerebral palsy can improve referral and intervention outcomes. The project has started training doctors and paramedics in:
 - Hammersmith Infant Neurological Examination (HINE)
 - APGAR assessment (Appearance, Pulse, Grimace, Activity, Respiration)The training program is being led by Dr. Raman Kumar, Senior Paediatric Neurologist at Liaquat National Hospital, Karachi.

Important Note:

Since 2022, the new education is stopped by the Office bearers, now it's a need to reopen new registration, hundreds of parents of special needs children are waiting for registration.

Vision

The project aims to build a comprehensive, community-based support system where children with special needs receive early diagnosis, timely rehabilitation, appropriate assistive technology, and family-centered care regardless of financial status.

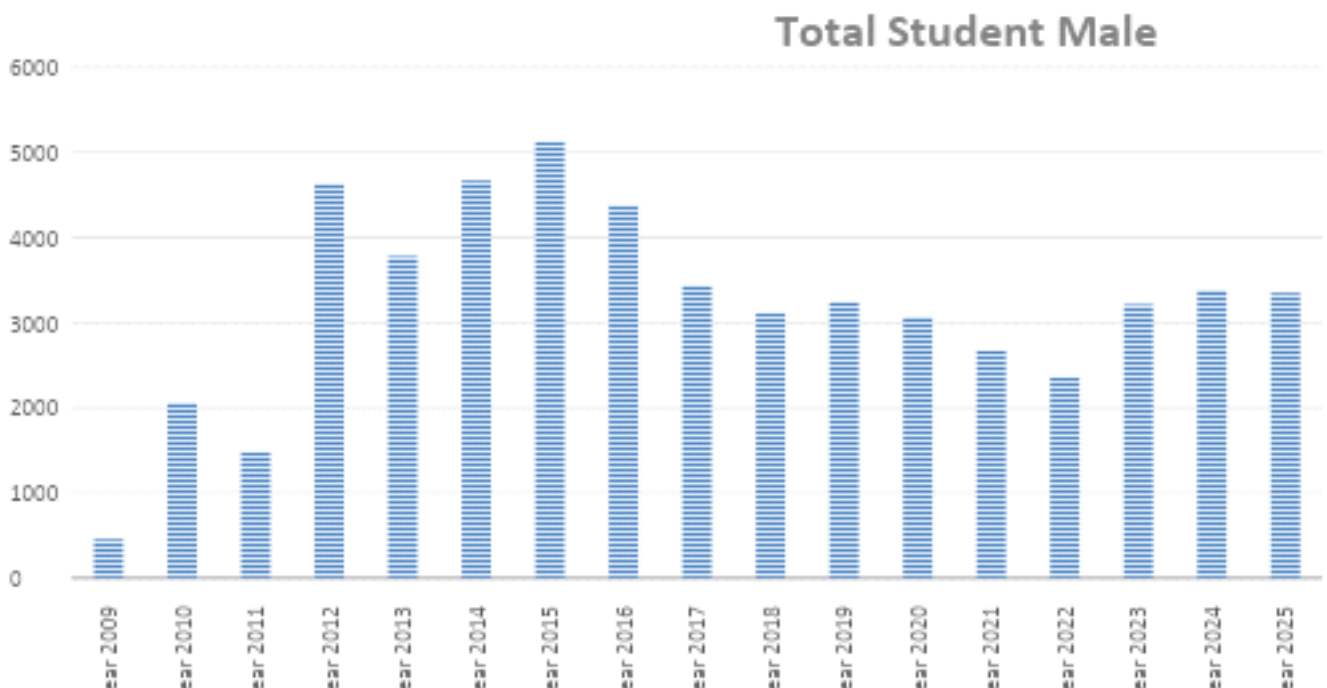

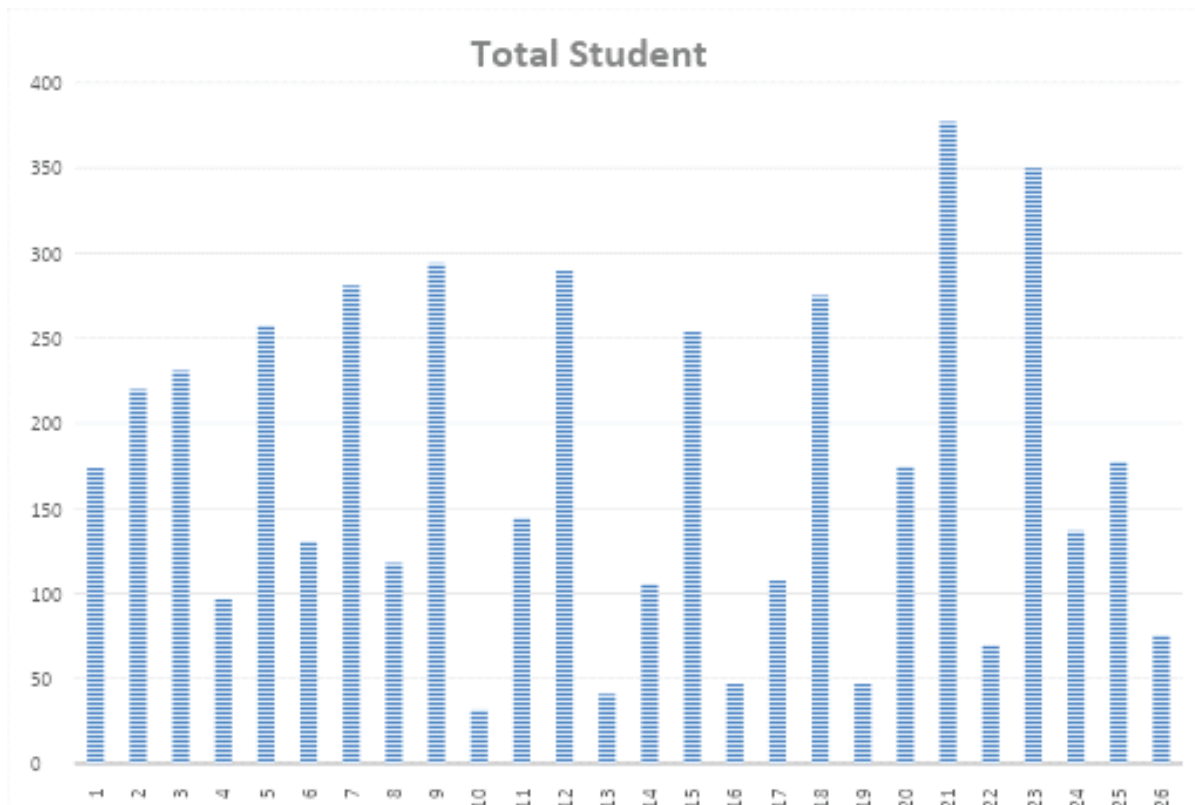

Prime Minister's Youth Skill Development Program Batch-3

MITI signed MOU with NAVTTC for training of 300 students 9 industrial demand driven Courses under Prime Minister's Youth Skill Development Program.



Hospitality & Tourism Batch II

Under the Prime Minister's Youth Skill Development Program (PMYSDP), the NAVTTC launched the Hospitality and Tourism Sector Program to equip Pakistani youth with industry-relevant skills for both local and international employment opportunities. In this regard, MITI signed a MoU with NAVTTC to provide training to 125 trainees in high-demand hospitality trades, including Bakery and Patisserie, Culinary Arts, and Professional Cook. The program aimed to enhance employability, develop a skilled workforce aligned with industry requirements, and create sustainable career pathways for youth in the rapidly growing hospitality and tourism sector.



ABAD Industry-Led Training Program

Under the PMYSDP Industry-Led Training Program, funded by the NAVTTC in collaboration with the Association of Builders and Developers of Pakistan (ABAD), MITI implemented a demand-driven skills development initiative to address the workforce needs of Pakistan's construction sector. Through this program, 75 trainees received competency-based training in Building Electrician and Plumber/Pipe Fitter trades. The initiative aimed to develop a skilled workforce aligned with industry requirements, enhance employability opportunities for youth, and provide qualified manpower to support the growth and sustainability of the construction industry.



Saudi Arabia TAKAMOL Skill Verification Program

Memon Industrial & Technical Institute (MITI) is an officially recognized testing center for the Saudi Arabia TAKAMOL Skill Verification Program (SVP) through the National Vocational and Technical Training Commission (NAVTTTC). The Skill Verification Program, initiated by the Kingdom of Saudi Arabia, aims to regulate its labor market by assessing and certifying the competencies of skilled workers, ensuring they possess the required knowledge and practical skills to perform their jobs effectively. The internationally recognized certification issued under the program is mandatory for obtaining skilled worker visas for employment in Saudi Arabia.

MITI is authorized to conduct skill assessment tests in various trades, including HVACR, Welding, Auto Mechanic, Electrician, and Plumbing. In 2025, the scope of the program was further expanded with the addition of new trades, including Chef, Barber, Tailor, and Automotive Mechanic. Through its role as a TAKAMOL Testing Center, MITI continues to facilitate international employment opportunities for skilled Pakistani workers by providing accessible, industry-recognized skill verification services.



Summer of Code Programme Batch-2

Memon Industrial & Technical Institute (MITI) has signed a Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) with the National Vocational & Technical Training Commission (NAVTTTC) to train 30 professional students in Artificial Intelligence (ML&DL) and Big Data Analytics Techniques Courses. This initiative is part of the Prime Minister's Youth Skill Development Program, aimed at equipping young professionals with high-demand digital skills. Upon successful completion of the training, all students appeared for an international Microsoft examination.





International Accreditation with City & Guilds UK

In 2025, Memon Industrial & Technical Institute (MITI), a project of the World Memon Organization (WMO), achieved a significant milestone by obtaining International Accreditation from City & Guilds with the support of National Vocational & Technical Training Commission (NAVTTTC) and GEMS Middle East. To commemorate this achievement, an Accreditation Awarding Ceremony was held at MITI in the presence of the Honorable Chief Guest, Ms. Gulmina Bilal, Chairperson NAVTTTC, Government of Pakistan. This prestigious accreditation recognizes MITI's commitment to delivering high-quality technical and vocational education aligned with international standards. The accreditation enhances opportunities for Pakistani youth to acquire globally recognized qualifications and improves their employability in local and international job markets, particularly in GCC and European countries.



MoU with Savaira Foundation for Youth Empowerment through Skills Development

On 18 February 2025, Memon Industrial & Technical Institute (MITI) signed a Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) with the Savaira Foundation to promote skills development and empower underprivileged youth through market-oriented vocational training programs. As part of this collaboration, Dr. Yasmeen Khan, President of Savaira Foundation, and Ms. Nasreen Tariq, Welfare Manager, visited MITI and formally signed the MoU. The partnership aims to enhance access to quality technical and vocational education, improve employability, and create sustainable livelihood opportunities for deserving youth from underserved communities.

MITI prides itself in becoming a premier institution for vocational training in the country and the management and staff of MITI are committed in its continued growth to help the destitute people of society for upward mobility.

We are humbled by the achievements and are grateful to Allah SWT for guiding us in the right direction and giving success in our ventures.

Expansion and Renovation of Facilities

By the grace of Allah, MITI has completed 16 years of operation. In these 16 years, we have served more than 140,000 students. The graduating students have been well received by the industry locally as well as internationally which is due to hard work and commitment of the management and our faculty team. To achieve these objectives, our workshops and other facilities were purpose built to satisfy the training needs of the time.

The time has now come when we are faced with the necessity of the following:

1. Addition of new equipment:

Many of the equipment and facilities have become old while new ones have not been added. The present facilities are falling behind the requirements and advancements in industry.

Computer hardware is one big area which requires up gradation. Our computers are no longer compatible with the software that are now available and have become standards of the industry and which we are teaching. So far, we have been coping with these requirements by ad hoc up gradations but this has a limit. PKR 25,000,000 are required for upgrading all the computers in our classes.

2. New Courses

To remain competitive, it is necessary to keep pace with the needs of the students and employers and introduce new courses from time to time. We have fallen behind in this important feature and introduce new courses very soon. We badly need to begin the following courses which are demands of the industry:

Industrial Electronics
Instrumentation
Fashion Marketing & Merchandizing
Auto body Refinishing
Renewable Energy

3. Expansion of Facilities:

Besides the academic needs, there are needs of building and facilities.

New class rooms/labs are required for the DAE section. PKR 10,000,000 are required.

Our power bill is very high. The answer is in going for solar. This solution is most economical in the long run but initial investment is high. We have already installed solar generation of 50 KW but now require to increase to 100 KW. PKR 14,000,000 are required for this project

The fiber glass roof is leaking badly and needs to be replaced. We also need a fully functional and well-equipped Auditorium.

Your valuable contribution in this cause is the dire need of MITI which can rightly be called the flagship project of the World Memon Organization.

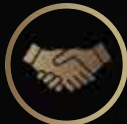

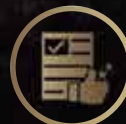

SPARK 4.0 wasn't just a conference-it was a journey of learning that integrated fun, reflection, and growth.

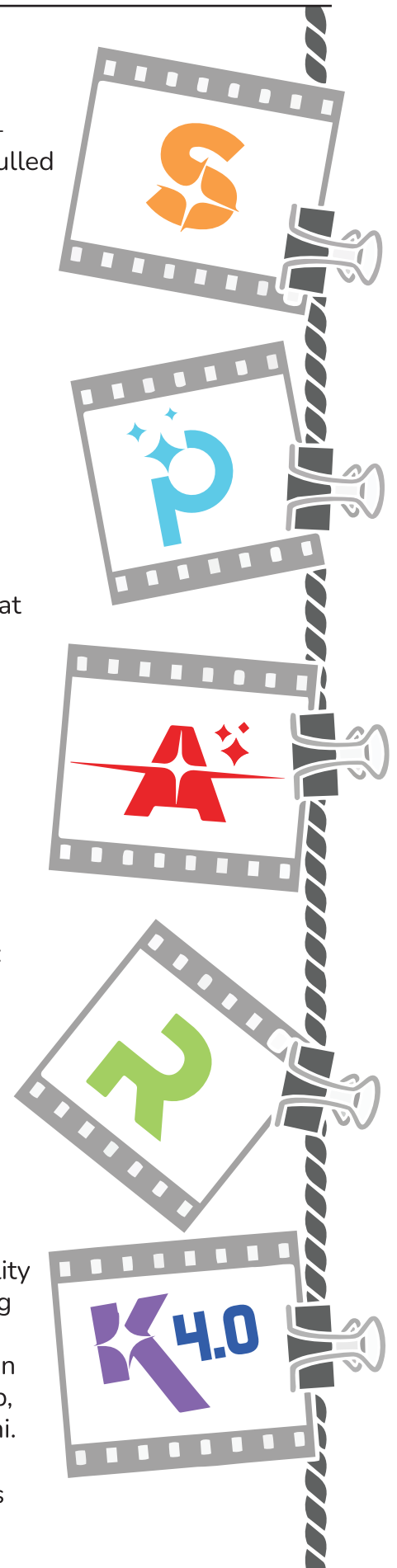
We set out with a theme defined for each day, namely;

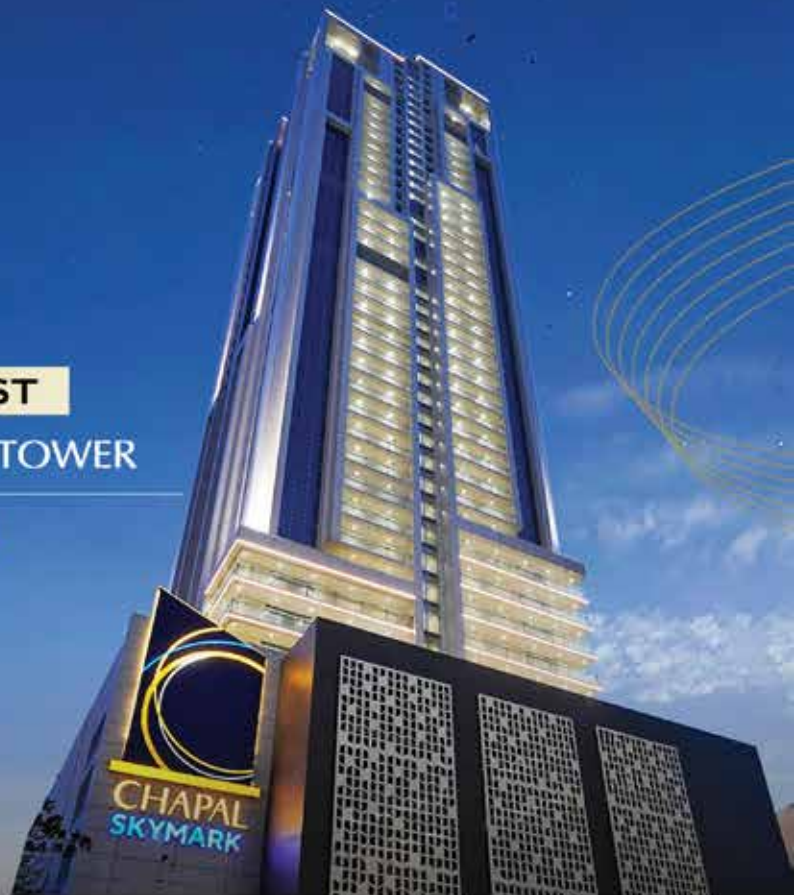

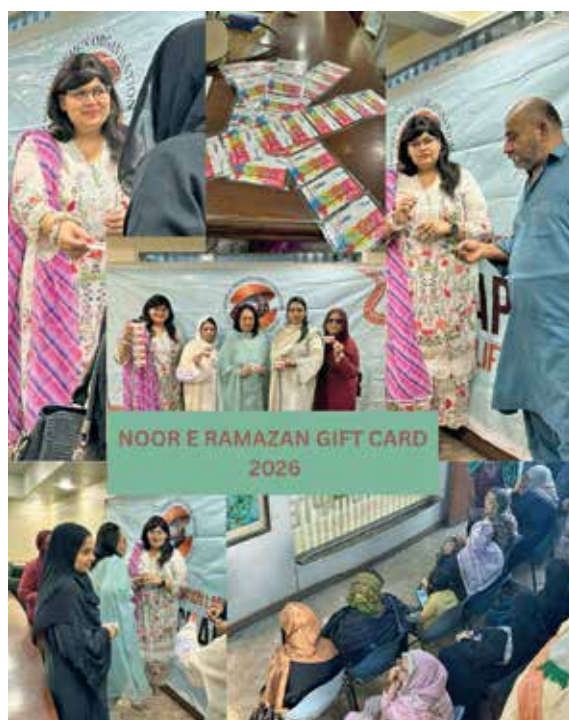
Noor E Ramazan Gift Card Distribution

The **WMO USA & Canada Chapter** contributed essential supplies for patients - delivered on the very same day.

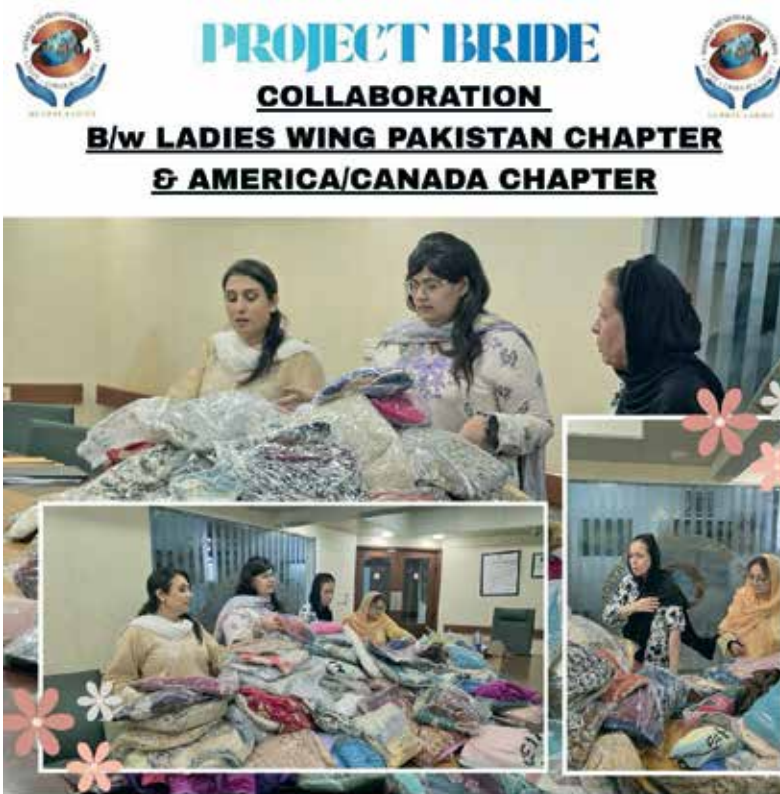

Together, we continue to invest in futures that matter.

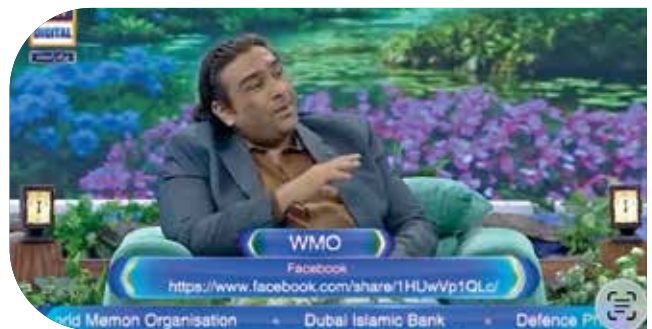

 - Until October 2025, monthly crossed cheques were issued in the name of each beneficiary, with their CNIC number clearly mentioned to ensure proper identification and complete transparency.
 - In a major step towards modernization and financial inclusion, from November 2025 onwards, WMOPC initiated the opening of individual bank accounts for all beneficiaries. This transition enables monthly financial assistance to be transferred directly into beneficiaries' accounts, enhancing operational efficiency, strengthening accountability, and empowering recipients through access to formal banking services.

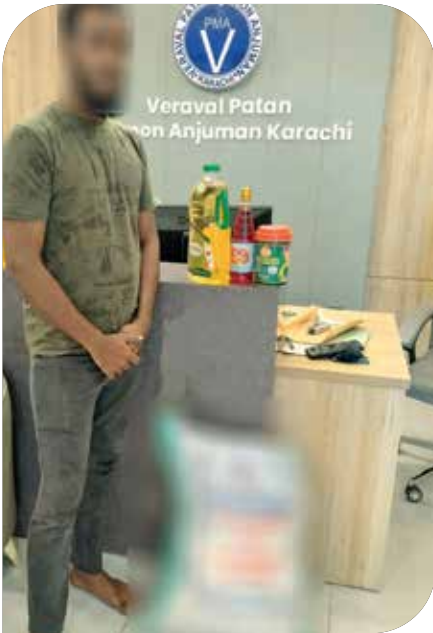

DISTRIBUTION OF QURBANI MEAT

On the blessed occasion of ****Eid-ul-Adha 2025****, the ****World Memon Organization – Pakistan Chapter (WMOPC)** successfully carried out its annual Qurbani Meat Distribution Program with the generous support of its valued donors and well-wishers. This initiative reflected the true essence of sacrifice, compassion, and community service by ensuring that deserving families could also share in the blessings of Eid.

A total of 15 cows were sacrificed on behalf of our donors at a modern, hygienically managed slaughterhouse under the supervision of the WMOPC team. The entire process was carried out in accordance with Islamic principles while adhering to the highest standards of hygiene, food safety, and quality control.

The processing of the meat followed a systematic and well-organized procedure. After the Qurbani, each animal was carefully processed using an overhead conveyor system. The hide and head were removed, followed by the hygienic removal of internal organs. The carcasses were then thoroughly cleaned with pressurized water before being divided into manageable portions.

Each portion was weighed using computerized digital scales, accurately tagged with the respective donor's details, and transferred to temperature-controlled cold storage to preserve freshness and maintain quality. The meat was subsequently cut into consumer-sized portions and packed in food-grade plastic bags containing approximately 2 to 2.5 kilograms each. These packs were stored in freezers until distribution and later transported in refrigerated vehicles to ensure the cold chain remained intact throughout the delivery process.

The packaged meat was distributed through various local Jamaats to deserving and underprivileged families across different regions. This coordinated distribution ensured that the blessings of Eid-ul-Adha reached those who were unable to afford meat due to financial hardship, allowing them to celebrate the occasion with dignity and joy.

WMOPC extends its heartfelt appreciation to all our generous donors, dedicated volunteers, Jamaat representatives, and everyone who contributed to the successful execution of this noble initiative. Their unwavering support and commitment exemplify the values of generosity, unity, and service that define our community.

May Almighty Allah (SWT) accept the Qurbani of all our donors, bless them with abundant rewards, and grant His countless blessings to everyone who participated in this humanitarian effort. Ameen.

APPEAL FOR ZAKAT & DONATION FOR THE YEAR 2026

The WMO Pakistan Chapter, being the largest and most active of the nine chapters, has also launched many welfare projects in Pakistan to address the various social issues faced by the large memon population settled in Karachi & interior Sindh. Over 25,000 individual are benefiting annually from WMO Pakistan Chapter's Welfare schemes:

- **Education for All Scheme:**

Under this scheme, we provide financial assistance for school fees to needy students of the Memon Community up to intermediate Level, enabling them to continue their education and become supportive members of their families and the community as a whole. We also extend school fee and van fee assistance to special children, ensuring inclusive access to education. The Maximum annual assistance provided under this scheme is PKR 36,000 (USD 130) per annum for students up to Matriculation, PKR 72,000 (USD 260) per annum for intermediate students, PKR 120,000 (USD 430) per annum for special children.

- **Higher Education Scheme:**

Under this scheme, we provide financial assistance to students of the Memon Community to pursue higher & professional education and other recognized disciplines. Approximately 2150 students from the Memon Community are currently benefiting from this scheme. Financial support of up to PKR 200,000 (USD 720) per annum per student is provided to help them continue their academic and professional journey.

- **Empowering through inclusion by providing Special Children:**

Empowering through inclusion, this initiative is dedicated to supporting special children by providing comprehensive medical examinations, regular therapies, specialized treatments, essential medicines, & assistive devices such as wheelchairs, hearing aids, & other supportive equipment. Our mission is to ensure that every child receives the care, dignity, & opportunities they truly deserve. To date, we have successfully supported 200 students, including both Memon and non-Memon beneficiaries, promoting equal access to healthcare & inclusive community support. The average annual cost per child is PKR 280,000 (USD 1,000), covering medical care, therapies, & essential assistive support required for their development & well-being.

- **Rehabilitation:**

Under this initiative, we are committed to the rehabilitation of poor and deserving families within the Memon community by helping them secure safe, stable, and dignified shelter. With more than 50% of the Memon population living below the poverty line and struggling to meet even basic household expenses, the need for housing support has become increasingly urgent. Through this program, we provide financial assistance to eligible families for the purchase of homes, enabling them to move from rented accommodations to owning a secure roof over their heads. At present, the minimum cost of a modest flat is approximately PKR 5 million (USD 17,800), highlighting the magnitude of support required to permanently transform a family's living condition.

- **Rozgar Scheme:**

Under this initiative, we provide support to poor and needy families of the Memon community by enabling them to earn an honorable livelihood. Assistance is offered for small businesses, as well as for acquiring sewing machines,

auto rickshaws, and motorcycles, helping families become self-reliant and improve their socio-economic status. WMO has previously provided short business loans, auto rickshaws, & motorcycles under this scheme. This year, the plan is to support Memon youth who wish to work by providing them motorcycles, enabling them to earn a living through platforms such as Bykea & Foodpanda & support their families.

- **Health Card Project:**

This initiative is a sincere effort to protect deserving Memon families from the heavy burden of medical expenses. Through this Health Coverage Project, each selected family will receive medical coverage of PKR 500,000 per member, ensuring access to quality treatment, hospital care, and emergency support when they need it most. With a contribution starting from just PKR 14,000 (USD 50) per family, you can help secure the health, dignity, & peace of mind of a struggling family.

- **Memon Industrial and Technical Institute:**

MITI is a vocational and Training center for the youth, offering a wide variety of technical, IT, multimedia & home economic courses. MITI has always been the flag bearer of the Humanitarian work done by the WMO & offers scholarships to 12,000 of deserving students include female 7000 & male 5000 each year. Over 100,000 graduates of MITI have secured employment or are self-employed. All the welfare activities of WMO Pakistan Chapter have been made possible only due to the continuous financial support of generous donors such as you kind selves. We thank you for your continuous support & encouragement over the years.

The projects highlighted above represent only a selection of our key initiatives presented to illustrate the breadth and impact of our work. In addition, several other development and welfare programs are being actively implemented under the World Memon Organisation Pakistan Chapter (WMOPC). 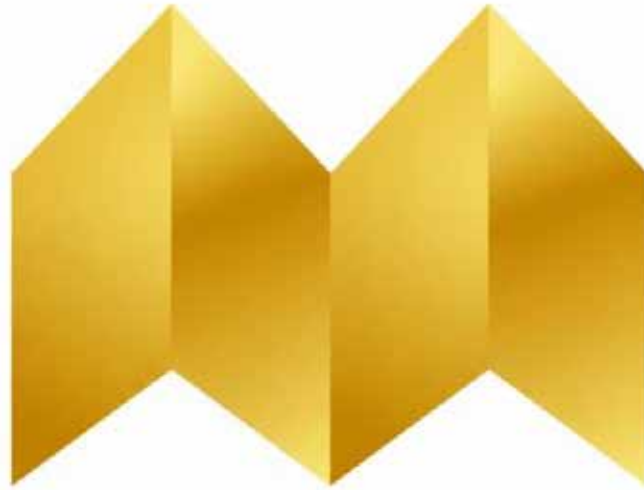
